Died 26 March 1969 in Cawood, Selby, E Yorks, aged 79

He was a RH batsman.

Yorks career – 1924-1925

His highest score of 48 was made against Lancs at Redcar CC on 4 & 5 Aug 1924 in the Minor Counties Championship.

Died 10 March 1985 in Ludgrove, Wokingham, Berks, aged 79.

He was a RH batsman

He was county captain in 1930, succeeding William Worsley. He received his cap in the same year. His appointment raised a few eyebrows but it turned out to be an inspired choice. Although Yorkshire did not win the title in his only season (they finished third and Lancashire were champions) the foundations had been laid for the championship-winning sides of the 1930s under A B Sellars and F E Greenwood.

Barber was also a very good golfer and footballer. After one season, he returned to academe and became headmaster of Ludgrove preparatory School, the main feeder to Eton.

162) **Arthur BASTOW** – Born 25 Jan 1897 in Normanton, W Yorks

Yorks career – 1924-1927

His highest score (12) came in the Minor Counties Championship against Notts at Thrum Hall, Halifax on 16 & 17 July 1924. It was in the same game that he recorded his best bowling figures of 6/66.

Died 27 Dec 1971 in Paignton, Devon, aged 68.

He was a LH batsman and LA medium-fast bowler.
