250) **Norman Walter Dransfield YARDLEY**- Born 19 March 1915, Gawber, Barnsley, S Yorks
Died 3 Oct 1989, Sheffield, aged 74.

He was a RH batsman and RA medium-paced bowler. He could keep wicket if necessary.

Test debut – v South Africa, Wanderers , Johannesburg, 24-28 Dec 1938

First-class debut – v Sussex (for Cambridge Un) at Fenner`s, 1-3 May 1935 (University Match)

Yorks career – 1932-1955

His highest test score (99) came against South Africa at Trent Bridge on 7-11 June 1947. Herbert Sutcliffe (v South Africa, Cape Town, 31 Dec 1927-4 Jan 1928), Geoff Boycott (v West Indies, Port of Spain, 30 Mar-5 Apr 197) and Martyn Moxon (v New Zealand , Auckland, 25-29 Feb 1988) are other Yorks Test cricketers and openers who have suffered the same fate.

His best Test bowling figs came against Australia at the Melbourne CG on 1-7 Jan 1948 (3rd Test)

His career –best score (183*) came against Hants at Headingley on 18-21 Aug 1951 (County Championship)

His career-best bowling figs (6/29 for Cambridge Un in the match against the MCC at Lord`s on 29 June to 2 July 1946

E gained his Yorks cap in 1937. He was one of five Wisden Cricketers of the Year in 1948. An all-round sportsman, he also played Hockey, Squash and Rugby Fives while at Cambridge University. He won his blue in all three sports. He attended St Peter's York before university. He followed Brian Sellars as Yorks captain (1948-1955) and went to Australia as Walter Hammond's vice-captain in 1946.

However, he was not a successful captain. England had to face Bradman Lindwall and Miller, amongst others and Yorkshire had only one shared Championship (1949) under his tenancy. He became a radio commentator after his playing days.
