Died 20 Apr 1941, flying from HMS Formidable off the coast of Tripoli, Libya, aged 25

First-class debut – v Lancs, playing for Oxford Un, at the Parks on 20-22 May 1936 (University match)

Yorks career – 1936-1938

He made his highest first class score (123) in the match against Somerset, playing for Northants at Northampton on 29 July to 1 Aug 1939 (County Championship)

His only bowling spells occurred in the matches against Yorks for Oxford Un at the Parks (3-5 May 1939) and for Northants against Warwicks at Northampton on 12-15 Aug 1939 (County Championship)
