He played for Cheshire in one Minor Counties Championship match against Lancs on 18 & 19 June 1952 at Luke & Spencers Gd, Altrincham. He then played six more games for Yorks in the same competition in 1952 & 1953.

His highest score (22*) came in the Minor Counties Championship game against Staffs at Oldfields Gd, Uttoxeter on 12 & 13 Aug 1953

His best bowling figures (7/20) came in the Minor Counties Championship game against Northumberland at Wiggington Rd, York on 6 & Aug 1952 (his debut match for Yorks)

He was awarded his Yorks cap in 1958 and captained the first eleven in 1958 and 1959. After may disruptive years, the County turned to Burnet, who had captained the second eleven from 1953 and had won the Minor Counties Championship in 1957. Yorkshire could only finish 11th in 1958 but were County Champions under Burnet in 1959.

He had played for and captained Baildon CC (Bradford CL) to three successive championships. After retiring from playing, Burnet joined the Yorks Committee but lost his place in the upheavals of the 1980s. He later chaired the Sports Council and was awarded an OBE for his services to the sport.

379) **Michael Joseph (“Mike”) COWAN** – Born 16 June 1933, Leeds

He was a RH batsman and LA fast-medium bowler

First-class debut – v MCC, Lord’s, 2-4 May 1953 (Other first-class match)

Yorks career – 1952-1962

His highest first-class score (22) came in the match against Warwicks at Edgbaston on 1-3 June 1955 (playing for the Combined Services)

His best first-class bowling figures (9/43) came in the match against Warwicks at Edgbaston on 20-23 Aug 1960 (County Championship)

Both performances were career-best efforts

He was awarded his Yorks cap in 1960. He was one of many players who partnered Fred Trueman but suffered many injuries, which meant that he missed the whole of the 1959 season. His only full season was in 1960. He also had to return home early from Pakistan, where he was touring with the MCC.

He has the distinction of taking more wickets (276) than he scored runs (233). Bill Bowes (1531 runs & 1639 wkts) is another example.

He played one game for Leics 2nd XI in 1963 and later, in club cricket, for Bingley (Bradford CL), Doncaster Town CC (Yorks CL), Littleborough CC and Rochdale CC (both Central Lancs CL). He also played Minor Counties cricket for Northumberland. After retiring, he became a very successful after-dinner speaker and even plied his trade on cruise liners.

380) **Brian HALL** – Born 16 Sept 1929, Morley, W Yorks
Died 27 Feb 1989, Doncaster, aged 59

He was a RH batsman and RA medium-fast bowler
