He began his cricket as a youngster with his local Hull club and also played at Headingley for the Leeds CC. He joined Yorks as a 19 year old in 1953 and was capped in 1957. In his time at Headingley, he proceeded to re-write the record books as far as Yorks Wicket-Keepers were concerned.

He played in a grand total of 412 consecutive County Championship games in 15 years and only missed one first class game in that time against Oxford Un, when he had been called up by MCC. In the 1960 season, he held 96 catches, still a national record. He also completed 11 stumpings and his season total of 107 victims remains a Yorkshire record. In seasons 1961 to 1963, he also completed three more of the best five seasons as far as Yorks Wicket-Keepers were concerned.

He was a Wisden Cricketer of the Year in 1969, along with David Green (Glos & Lancs), Barry Richards (Hants), Derek Underwood (Kent & Eng) and Ossie Wheatley (Glam). His benefit season of 1967 had raised £5,351 (or £97,764.69 in 2020)

In 1972 and 1973, he played Minor Counties cricket for Lincs. He then began working for an American engineering firm and emigrated to California.

390) **Harold Dennis (“Dickie”) BIRD** – Born 19 April 1933, Barnsley, S Yorks

He was a RH batsman and OB bowler

First-class debut – v Scotland, the Circle, Hill on 16-18 May 1956 (Scotland in England)

Yorks career – 1953-1959

His highest score (181*) came against Glam at Bradford PA on 23-26 May 1959.

His only success with the ball came in the Minor Counties Championship game against Lincs at the Circle, Hull on 29 & 30 June 1955

He began his cricket career with Barnsley CC at the age of 16, about the time when Geoff Boycott and Michael Parkinson were also paying for the club. His first-class career is perhaps best remembered for the 181* he made for Yorks in the County Championship against Glam at Bradford Pain 1959 only to find himself dropped for the next game against Somerset at Harrogate CC.

So he left Yorks and joined Leics for the 1960 season, when his new county capped him.

After leaving the first-class game, he joined Paignton CC in Devon where he was much more successful with the bat and also took coaching qualifications. He worked as a coach at Plymouth College and in Rhodesia (now Zimbabwe) and Transvaal (now Gauteng).

He began umpiring in 1970 and always seemed to attract unusual events in matches where he was officiating. For example in June 1975, he was at Buxton for Derbys v Lancs match when snow stopped play. And later, in 1988 at Headingley, in a Test Match against the West Indies, a water main burst and water bubbled up onto the ground, causing play to be suspended under a cloudless sky with the sun beating down. A restless crowd berated him and some tense exchanges ensued.

He was awarded the MBE in 1986 and the OBE in 2012. In 2014 and 2015, he was President of Yorks and watched every game as his beloved won and then retained the County Championship. He has also been a generous benefactor to the White Rose with the Dickie Bird clock that adorns what was the Western Terrace (now divided into the Family Stand, the 1863 Enclosure and the Popular Enclosure.

391) **James William CAMMISH** – Born 21 May 1921, Scarborough
Died 16 July 1974, Napier, Hawke's Bay, New Zealand, aged 53

He was a RH batsman and LB bowler

Anthony Card was another of those players whose appearances for Yorkshire coincided exactly with emergence and establishment of Johnnie Wardle in the side. Like Wardle, Card bowled left-arm wrist spin and also some leg-spin.

So Card moved after just two seasons and a mere 5 games.

He played two first class games, both for the MCC in 1955 and 1958.

From 1956 to 1958, he was a member of the Middlesex second eleven in the Minor Counties Championship.

He also played in the newly established second eleven championship and played eight games for Leicestershire second eleven in 1959, as well as some Club and Ground matches for the Midland county.

After cricket, he worked in Animal Welfare.

393) **K M GODDARD** – No biographical details are available for this player. He played four matches for the second eleven between 1952 and 1955.

His highest score (25) came in the Minor Counties Championship game against Lancs at Scarborough on 25 & 26 May 1953

His best bowling figures (1/31) came in the Minor Counties Championship game against Lincs at Brumby Hall, Scunthorpe on 8 & 9 Aug 1955

He was educated at Cheltenham College and also served in the Army, for whom he also played. He was the nephew of George Macauley (Yorks & Eng; 8 Tests and 468 matches for Yorks, 1920-1935). Lister later became the Secretary of the Yorkshire CCC in 1971 and served almost 20 years in post. The time was bedevilled by all the internal squabbles of the 1980s, although none were of Lister's making and he emerged with honour intact.

For the 1954 season, he had left to join Worcs as Assistant Secretary and also captained the second eleven. He was with them until 1971, when he returned to Headingley.

397) **Brian MACHIN** – No biographical details are available for this player. He was a RH batsman. He played just two games for Yorks in 1953. He also played one game in 1954 for Cheshire in the Minor Counties Championship.

His highest score (12*) came in the Minor Counties game against Northumberland at Jesmond on 1953

His best bowling figures (2/35) came in the friendly game against Cumberland & Westmoreland at Edenside, Carlisle on 17 & 18 June 1953
