In his formative years, a young Chris Balderstone played for Paddock CC in the Huddersfield League. He was later, in 1959 and 1961, a professional with Baildon CC in the Bradford League.

Chris Balderstone spent 10 years with Yorkshire, playing alongside Don Wilson. Also, by 1970, a young Phil Carrick was emerging so Balderstone accepted the overtures of Ray Illingworth and moved south to Leicestershire. His move coincided with some of the most successful years in the history of the Midlands club.

In 1972, they won the Benson & Hedges cup; 1974 saw victory in the Sunday League and the club's first County Championship arrived in 1975. That year also saw them achieve a cup and league double as they won the Benson and Hedges trophy for the second time. A third and final victory in the Benson & Hedges in 1985 was in Balderstone's penultimate year at Grace Road.

His two test matches saw him come up against the West Indies pace attack (1976) as they developed the firepower that was to dominate world cricket for some time.

After he left Leicestershire, he went into umpiring and spent 12 years on the first class panel.

Chris Balderstone was also a professional footballer, playing for Huddersfield Town, for whom he was signed by Bill Shankly in 1958. He played 131 games for the Terriers before moving to Carlisle United in 1965. His first season at Brunton Park coincided with Carlisle's promotion to the second division.

He stayed in the north-west for 11 years and this period included the only season Carlisle United spent in the old first division (1974/75). Indeed, after the first three games, they led the table but sank back into the second division at the end of the season.

After he left Carlisle United, he moved to South Yorkshire with Doncaster Rovers. While with Doncaster, Balderstone established a record that can certainly never be broken.

On 15 September 1975, he was playing for Leicestershire against Derbyshire at Chesterfield's Queen's Park in the County Championship. He was unbeaten on 51 at close of play on the second day and then raced off to Doncaster to play for them in a 1-1 draw with Brentford.

He then returned to Chesterfield, completed his century and helped Leicestershire to their first County Championship. There he followed a brief spell with Queen of the South in Scotland.

His final Club was Enderby Town, later called Leicester United. The club played in the Leicestershire Senior League and later in the Southern League. The Club was wound up in 1996.

In 1984, Chris Balderstone played for East Lancashire CC in the Lancashire League against Nelson CC, who included in their side one Barry Wood, another Yorkshireman who moved counties, in his case to Lancashire, and who later played test cricket.

All who knew him, including Vanburn Holder, West Indian Test bowler and later umpire in England and Bernie Cromack, who was a contemporary of Balderstone's at Grace Road, agreed that Balderstone was a perfect gentleman in all he did.

He was capped by Leics in 1973 and had a joint benefit with Ken Higgs in 1984, which raised £64,470 (or £208,591.67 in 2020)

467) **D H BEACHALL** – No biographical details are available for this player. He played just two games in the Minor Counties Championship, both in 1960. The first was against Cumberland at Edenside, Carlisle, on 6 & 7 July 1960. He scored 1 in his only innings. He did not bowl or take a catch.

His second and final game was against Northumberland at the Circle, Hull, on 11 & 12 July 1960. Again, he did not bat nor did he take any catches. He did, however, bowl 2-0-23-0.

468) **Jack Burkinshaw BETHELL** – Born Q3, 1938, Sheffield. He played just two games for Yorks in 1960 in the Minor Counties Championship and Second Eleven Championship and then two more in the Second Eleven competition for Somerset in 1966.

His highest score (79*) was made for Somerset second eleven in the Second Eleven Championship against Northants at Northampton on 6 & 7 June 1966

470) **S Gordon CHADWICK** – No biographical details are available for this player. He was a Wk and played just one game in the Minor Counties Championship against Lincs at Brumby Hall, Scunthorpe on 10 & 11 Aug 1960. He did not bat but completed one catch and two stumpings.

471) **Anthony (Tony”) CLARKSON** – Born 5 Sept 1939, Killinghall, Harrogate.

He was a RH batsman and OB bowler.

First-class debut – v Glos at the Ashley Down Gd, Bristol, on 19-21 June 1963 (County Championship)

Yorks career – 1960-1964

His highest first-class score (131) came in the County Championship game against Northants at Northampton on 19-22 July 1969 (playing for Somerset)

Tony Clarkson`s innings of 102* in the John Player Sunday League was the first by an English player. He was capped by Somerset in 1968. He also played club cricket in the North Yorks & South Durham CL for Darlington RA and Middlesbrough. He played for Harrogate CC in the Yorkshire CL and in the Bradford CL for Windhill CC. He served as a First-Class Umpire from 1992 to 2004.

472) **T W HARPER** – No biographical details are available for this player. He played just one games for Yorks in 1960.

In the Minor Counties Championship, he played against Northumberland at Jesmond CC on 20 & 21 June 1960. He did not bat but bowled 27-5-106-2 in the match, with best figures of 2/62. He took one catch. He then played against Lancs at Old Trafford in the Second Eleven Championship on 25 & 26 Aug 1960, but for Notts. He made 0* in his only innings and had match figures of 14-2-42-0.

473) **John K HARRISON** – No biographical details are available for this player. He played five games for the county in 1960 and 1961.

His highest score (33) came in the Second Eleven Championship game against Derbys at Queen`s Park, Chesterfield on 8 & 9 Aug 1960

He has had a lifelong connection to Burley-in-Wharfedale CC, on the way to Ilkley, in the Airedale & Wharfedale Senior CL although he played a lot in the Bradford CL and captained several clubs in that competition.

474) **K HARTLEY** – No biographical details are available for this player. He played just one game in the Minor Counties Championship against Lincs at Brumby Hall, Scunthorpe on 10 & 11 Aug 1960.He did not bat and had match bowling figures of 8-2-22-0. He did not take a catch.

475) **M RICHARDSON** – No biographical details are available for this player. He played just two games for Yorks, separated by three years. His first game was a friendly encounter with Derbys Juniors at Abbeydale Park, Sheffield on 16 Aug 1960. He did not bat or take any catches but he did bowl 12-2-33-0. It is interesting to note that Yorks played as Yorks Colts in this match, a title the second eleven had not used since 1892.

He also had one game in the Minor Counties Championship against Lancs at Scarborough on 5 & 6 Aug 1963. He scored 2 in his only innings. He bowled 6-3-6-0 and took no catches.

476) **Michael John (“Mike”) SMEDLEY** – Born 28 Oct 1941, Maltby, S Yorks

He was a RH batsman

First-class debut – v Northants, Trent Bridge, 22-24 July 1964 (County Championship) This was for Notts as he did not play any first-class games for Yorks
Yorks career – 1960-1962

His highest first-class score (149) and career-best performance came in the County Championship game against Glam at Sophia Gardens, Cardiff
