BEDFORD GRAMMAR SCHOOL v. DULWICH COLLEGE.—The annual contest between the two Schools took place on Saturday last at the School Field in beautiful weather. The Dulwich Captain (C. AN OLD BEDFORD CRICKETER.
Writing of Mr. John Hughes, a well-known cricketer, formerly of Bedford, a contemporary says:—"Although Hertfordshire does not rank very high in the county list, it has produced some sterling cricketers, men who in their prime have been equal to the standard of any county, and among these not the least worthy was the veteran John Hughes. Mr. Hughes is perhaps the oldest county cricketer in Hertford, and he has now severed his connection with the club for some years, June 12th and 13th, 1882, being the last occasion on which he represented his County against an eleven from the neighbouring county of Essex. Mr. Hughes is now getting on in years, and when he says he began to play cricket at the age of 16, he has nearly half a century's practical experience of the game to look back upon, and the recollections of the players of that long period with which to delight his auditors, for he is an authority upon the cricket of that time, and not infrequently indulges in the most interesting reminiscences. He was born at Hertford and it is in the county town that Mr. Hughes is spending his retirement. The first match of importance in which he played was Hertford v. Ware. In those days T. Webster was a great bat, while Catlin was a man of local reputation. He apparently gave great satisfaction in his trial match, and continued to play for the town throughout the season. In the next year the youthful Hughes was called to Bedford in the course of his business as a tobacco-pipe maker. This circumstance was really the cause of his development in cricket. Lord Charles Russell had just succeeded in getting the head quarters of the Bedford County Club moved from Newport Pagnell to Bedford, and Hughes began to practise with the club. The bowler of the County Club rejoiced in the named of Hewitt, and he being a man of observation did not fail to discern signs of considerable promise in the under-hand bowler who passed his leisure time at the County practise ground. At the suggestion of Mr. Hewitt, Hughes learnt to bowl round-arm, and when he had attained some degree of proficiency in the art he was tried in a match against Biggleswade. The remaining two seasons spent at Bedford often saw him bowling for Bedford County. Returning to

Hertford, Balls Park C.C. chose Hughes to bowl for them against Epping. Meeting with some success in this match, he received a good many engagements, and then the Hon. Robert Grimston who used to get up county elevens to play various teams on No Man's Land, determined to give the young man a trial in a match against the "Old Haileyburians." So well did Hughes get on that Haileybury College engaged him for two afternoons a week, the only available time he had. Continuing to play for Hertford, Bishop Stortford, Epping, and the surrounding towns, the fast bowler of the eastern side on more than one occasion met St. Albans in the field, and the latter club began to play him. He took part in several big matches on their behalf, his highest score being 103 not out against Welwyn; the occasion was celebrated by the presentation of a bat to Mr. Hughes. Continuing to play for the border towns of Herts and Essex, Hughes also found himself much sought after for better matches now that he had fairly established his reputation as a reliable bowler. He played for the South of England against M.C.C., and when St. Albans played the South of England he wielded the ball for the city, and with his break-back bowling managed to perform the hat trick on Jupp, Humphrey, and Pooley. In the same match he bowled 22 consecutive overs. On several occasions he received engagements to play in All England matches, and when playing against the North of England at Litchfield he was opposed to the redoubtable George Parr. Staffordshire also played Hughes at one time. When Mr. Fred Caesar organised his short-lived "New All England" team, Hughes had a place therein as a bowler. While in the capacity of bowler to his team, he honoured Edinburgh with his presence, and exhibited his skill in several north country towns, while at the opposite end of the country, Hastings, Southsea, and one or two south-coast towns were afforded opportunities of witnessing his play. Of course Mr. Hughes' batting could not be so excellent as his bowling, and the continual strain of the latter exercise told on him when he wielded the willow, but he played good sound cricket on his last appearance, when he scored 32 against a team composed of W. G. Grace and several "stars" for the benefit of Frank Silcock, at Witham. When the Herts County Club was started it was natural such a champion should be engaged, and he bowled in the first match which the county ever played, and through several years the bowling for the shire was entrusted to him and Titchmarsh, with, generally speaking, very good results. For some seasons from the institution of the County Club, a bonus of £5 was offered to the county professionals for the best averages, and Mr. Hughes was often enriched to that extent owing to the havoc he wrought with his opponent's wickets. His bowling average was nearly always the best in the county, and it is worthy to note that in almost every county match he was first put on to bowl. Upon his ceasing to handle the leather in 1882 it was with feelings of general regret that the county executive received his resignation. Not only had he always done his best for his side, but by his disposition and demeanour, he made himself greatly respected and liked.—In Sept. 1865, Mr. Hughes was presented by many of his friends and admirers with a silver watch, gold chain, and a purse containing 63 sovereigns; and in June, 1880, on his retirement from the Herts. County team a match was played for his benefit at Bishop Stortford between an Eleven of England and fourteen of Herts, and resulted in a handsome sum being presented to him.


