WYCOMBE v. BIRMINGHAM.

One of the most important fixtures of the Wycombe Cricket Club was fixed to take place on Wednesday and Thursday. The weather was so wet on the former day that no play took place. Thursday being more favourable a start was made at 11.30. The Birmingham team, which was a strong one, but not so strong as that which opposed Oxford on Tuesday, went in first. The first three wickets fell for 12, but on Messrs. Diver and Glover becoming partners at the wicket they carried the score by some splendid cricket to 128 before a separation was effected. The fifth wicket fell for 178, while the remaining wickets only added 14 runs. Diver obtained his 81 by grand cricket, his hits including eleven fours, two threes, eight twos, and singles. Glover's well hit 47 included one six, five fours, two threes, two twos, and singles, and Wheeler's chief hits in his score of 32 were a five, a four, two threes, and three twos. Wycombe on going to the wickets commenced better than their opponents did, the first wicket falling for 20. The innings, however, closed for 69, Thurlow and Winslow being chief scorers with 14 each. Bird bowled with great success, taking 6 wickets for 30 runs, whilst Wheeler, an underarm bowler, took 3 wickets at a cost of 34 runs. The Marlow C.C. has just concluded a fairly successful season, with results almost exactly corresponding to those of 1890. Thirteen matches were played, and of these, six were won, six lost, and one unfinished owing to rain. One match (v. Heading at Reading) was not commenced owing to rain. In addition, two "A team" matches were played v. Sir W. Borlase's School. One of these was unfinished and the other lost. The wet weather which continued throughout the season caused scoring to be low, and affected the batting averages to a considerable extent. A wretched start was made, for although totals of 28 and 60 sufficed to defeat Hampstead at Marlow in the opening match, the next three fixtures were lost—v. Hampstead (away), v. Beaconsfield (home), v. Wycombe (home). Marlow batted twice in all these matches with the following paltry results:—

Fortunately this very low scoring was not kept up very long. Three out-matches followed, and two of these v. Uxbridge and v. Wycombe were won; whilst the rain saved Henley from defeat in the third. Oriel beat Marlow on August Bank-holiday, and this was followed by a six wicket defeat from an exceptionally powerful Reading team. At Beaconsfield, a very poor Marlow team beat a strong side representing the home club. Henley beat Marlow in the return match after a close game. The two last fixtures, v. Uxbridge, and v. Rev. Phipps's Eleven, were both won. It will thus be seen that only one of the out-matches ended unfavourably to the club.

Altogether, Marlow scored 1527 runs for 194 wickets—an average of 7.87 per wicket. The opposing teams scored 1591 runs for 202 wickets—an average of 7.87 runs per wicket, exactly the same as the Marlow average. Marlow's highest score was 190 v. Wycombe at Wycombe. The lowest was 26 v. Beaconsfield at Marlow. The highest innings against the Marlow bowling was Hampstead's 147 at Hampstead. The lowest, Hampstead's 23 at Marlow. Marlow three times scored more than 150 runs, but not a single innings above that number was registered against the club.

It will be seen that the batting figures are remarkably low, and the bowling unusually good. This of course is due to the wet wickets. The place of honour is occupied by W. Playford, but he only played in three matches. He alone averages more than 20 runs. Of the regular players, F. Ashby comes first with the very useful figures of 17.92 for 13 innings. Two of his contributions—59 at Henley and 68 at Beaconsfield—were simply invaluable. Paine comes next, thanks to a splendid 74 not out at Wycombe. Otherwise this young player did absolutely nothing, contributing five noughts in six innings, and twice securing the unenviable distinction of a "pair of spectacles." Barber and R. A. Lunn each earned one pair. W. H. Lunn and Barber are the only other players with a double figure average. Both show a great falling off from last year, when Lunn averaged 24 and Barber 19. Nearly all the other players show a decided falling off from last season, with the exception of R. A. Lunn. The batting figures of Morris, Tearle, Handcombody, G. M. Faulkner, the captain, and others, are disappointing.

The bowling statistics are much more satisfactory. G. M. Faulkner heads the list, with 20 wickets at a cost of 5.80 runs apiece. His best performance was against Henley—6 wickets for 8 runs. F. T. Handcombody comes next, but did not bowl very much. The brunt of the attack has been borne by the veteran Barber, and his figures—76 wickets at a cost of under 7 runs each—are wonderfully good. Of course the slow wickets suited him, but considering that he bowled right through several innings, his average is excellent. W. H. Lunn's average comes out well, but R. A. of that ilk did not bowl much, and his figures are not by any means so good as in 1890, when he stood at the top of the poll. Hearne, the Wycombe professional, played in a few matches, and secured 17 wickets at a fraction under ten runs each.

The fielding of the team has generally been good, and a vast improvement on the form displayed two or three years ago. One match (v. Henley at Marlow) was lost by bad fielding. Morris at point, Handcombody in the long field, the Lunnons, and the Captain all distinguished themselves. Mr. Ashby kept wicket with his usual ability, and Mr. Ward captained his team admirably. The batting was certainly the weak point of the club in 1891.

The WINDSOR AND ETON ALEXANDRA C.C. has just concluded a very successful season. Fourteen matches were played, ten won, three lost, and one drawn. The principal performers with the bat (with their averages) were Mr. J. Needham (28), Mr. E. H. Freaker (25), Mr. G. Stubbs (17), Mr. J. Shipman (17), and Mr. G. Smith (16).

On Tuesday last some interesting cricket was witnessed on the Wycombe ground in the match between Sir Edwin Dashwood's Eleven and Mr. Scott-Murray's Eleven. Victory rested with the first-named team, or the first innings by 98 runs to 81, but it is just possible that the verdict would have been reversed had the match been played out. J. T. Hearne, the Middlesex crack, bowled well for the winners, and so did Bowley (late Surrey) and Jones (Henley) for the losers. The weather was all that could be desired, and in striking contrast to that experienced during the height of the season.
