CRICKET.

SWANSEA V. NEATH.

The return match between the above teams was played on the ground of the former, on Saturday last, in anything but cricketing weather, rain falling throughout the greater part of the day. Consequently, the wicket was a very soft one. Neath, winning the toss, elected to go in first, and play was commenced at 12.45. At two o'clock, when the luncheon bell rung, Neath had scored 53 for the loss of seven wickets. Eldridge bowled very effectively, taking five wickets for 18 runs. After luncheon play was prevented for a considerable time owing to the rain. At 3.30 it was decided to play on, notwithstanding the rain, but after a few overs, they were obliged to retire until the rain had ceased. When play was again resumed, the remaining three wickets fell for 24 runs—total, 77. After the necessary interval, Swansea sent in E. Landers and W. J. Bancroft to the bowling of O. Jones and Witham. The runs came very slowly, only singles being scored, and when 11 was reached, Bancroft was bowled by Witham. H. Gage now partnered Landers, but after having added four, was bowled by Jones. E. Reid next took the place of Gage, and after scoring 5 was run out. J. P. Long now partnered Landers, who was playing carefully all the while. Long, after scoring a single and a 3, was dismissed by O. Jones. W. H. Gwynn was the next to face the bowling. After contributing 11, he asked Downey to leg which was nicely received by Thomas. J. H. Davies took the place of Gwynn. The second ball he received from O. Jones he cut beautifully to the boundary. Before the over was completed, he was sent back, having played a ball on to his wicket. H. B. Letcher now kept company with E. Landers. He scored a single off Downey. Landers next drove Downey to leg, but Letcher, who had evidently misjudged the distance the ball had travelled, started the third run, but failed to return in time to save his wicket. D. Griffiths next handled the willow. After scoring 3, time was called. E. Landers, who was not out, scored 23. Below is the score:—
