## NEWPORT v. THORNBURY.

Splendid weather favoured this match at Newport on Thursday, the proceeds being for the benefit of Mee and Hucknall, the Newport professionals. The visitors brought down a very strong team, including the veteran Dr E. M. Grace, F. L. Cole, J. H. Iles, Roberts, and other Gloucestershire players, and C. J. Robinson (Somersetshire). Newport had also got together a strong eleven. The ground was rather heavy, but Hucknall had got the best possible ready. The attendance, when the game commenced at 12 o'clock, was very small. Dr Grace won the toss, and elected to bat, going in himself in company with Robinson. The latter scored one, and then with the fourth ball of his first over Mee clean bowled the doctor—1-1-0. Cook was the next man in, but, after he had scored a two, he was also bowled by Mee. Robinson and Brown became associated, but at eight the former was also beaten by a ball from Mee. Cole filled the vacancy, and the prospects of Thornbury improved, the score being carried to 28 before Brown was caught by the Newport captain off Hucknall. Roberts, the Gloucestershire bowler, succeeded, but at 31 he sent a ball from Mee to Rees—31-5-3. Thurston joined Cole, but before he cracked his "duck" he was caught by Hornby off Mee. Miller took the retiring batsman's place, but with the score at 38 his balls were removed by Mee. Of the remaining batsmen, Howe was out at 54, Smith at 56, and Iles at 78, the innings closing at this figure. The feature of the innings was the grand bowling of Mee, who took nine wickets for 21 runs, five being clean bowled. The whole side, an exceedingly strong one, were disposed in just over an hour.
