CORSHAM CRICKET CLUB AVERAGES.—With the match against Lansdowne the Corsham Cricket Club brought their 1891 season to a close. The club has quite kept up the reputation of 1890, the averages being by far the best since the formation of the club. Twenty-two matches have been played, out of which no less than 18 have been won, 2 lost and 2 drawn, both of the latter being in their favour. Victories have been won against the following clubs:—St George's (2), Westbury (2), Calne (2), Melksham (2), Bristol Law Courts (2), Swindon G.W.R., Prior Park College, Bohemians, Lansdowne, Bath Association, Box, Widcombe Institute and G. T. Mitten's XI. The two defeats were inflicted by Bath Association and Chippenham, the drawn matches being with Swindon and Chippenham. H. S. P. Kinneir, who with the largest total of runs to his credit has the fine average of 36.6. E. G. Mayo comes next with 34, and has given good support in the few matches he has played in. C. F. Spackman, who takes fourth place, has increased his average from 21 last year to 31.7 this season, having compiled 635 runs. A very valuable addition to the team has been G. Reckless (Mr Harris's professional) who has the very good average of 21.7, and has also been very useful as a bowler. J. P. Mayo and A. C. Kinneir (captain) both have averages of over 20, the latter batsman having greatly improved. In the bowling department Jesse Smith comes first, having taken 101 wickets for the average of 5.6 per wicket, a remarkably good performance, the sticky wickets suiting his bowling to nicety. C. F. Spackman follows next, having secured 72 wickets at the cost of 6.8 per wicket. S. P. Kinneir takes third place with 48 wickets at the cost of 7.6 runs per wicket, while G. Reckless is fourth, having taken 27 wickets, at the cost of 9.1 per wicket. The club have an average of 191 runs per innings, or 17 runs per man, while their opponents only average 68 per innings, or 6 runs per man. Two hundred has been passed not less than 8 times, and three batsmen have made the century.
