The Rugby and Marlborough Match.—The struggle at Lord's between Marlborough and Rugby Schools is steadily growing in favour, and Wednesday's game will hold a foremost place in Marlborough annals, as the highest individual score made in a public school match at Lord's was placed on record, the hero of the occasion being P. R. Creed with 211. He was worthily assisted by W. Mortimer, who contributed 106. Marlborough has turned out some famous cricketers from its playground, the most notable being A. G. Steel, who held the record in this match with 128 until Creed has dwarfed it with his splendid contribution. Marlborough were at the wickets more than five hours, and ran up a total of 432. Rugby then took the bat and lost five wickets for a score of 65. On Thursday, as was expected after the first day's cricket, Rugby suffered a severe defeat at the hands of Marlborough, the latter winning by an innings, with 78 runs to spare.
