THE CHESTERTON v. LIBERALS CUP-TIE MATCH.

A PROTEST.

It is to be regretted that the Cambs. Cricket Association will be called upon to settle a dispute which has arisen over the recent cup-tie match—Liberals v. Chesterton. The matter in dispute is the question of J. O'Connor's qualification to play for the Liberals. The Chesterton C.C. contend that he is not eligible, while the Liberal C.C. maintains that O'Connor is fully qualified under the rules of the Association. There is a strange incident about the match which is calculated to puzzle the Association in their deliberations, and that is the fact that the very player whom the Chesterton C.C. objects to fielded (and therefore played) for them when they occupied the field against the Liberals. However, both clubs may rest assured that the Association will deal in a thoroughly impartial way with the question, and it is to be hoped that whatever the decision may be, it will be received in good faith by either club, and not allowed to reflect to the detriment of the Association.

TO THE EDITOR.

Sir,—But for the "par" in your issue of last evening, I should not have addressed you on the question, being satisfied with the impartiality of the Council in giving its award.

May I be excused for suggesting that no club (Liberals and Chesterton of course excepted) delegate left in the competition take part in the discussion or vote? I do not dispute their right to express their feelings, but contend that the decision of the Council would probably be better received if it is known that the Camden, Old Perseans, and Y.M.C.A. remain neutral. I desire to be permitted to say that the protest would have come with better grace had Chesterton objected to the player in question on the field.

By all means let the Council of the association have the facts before them, and pass judgment whether "Six months' residence in Cambs. immediately preceding any Tie in which he shall take part" is not complied with in the case under dispute. After their award, outsiders can put their own construction upon the rule. My fear is that, even thus far, the action now forced on the Council by a club beaten (and who last year, by the aid of doubtful decisions of umpires, beat the Liberals) will be detrimental to the association's future operations. Chesterton contend that the player in question is not eligible. The Liberals believe he is; Chesterton have everything to gain by protesting. If they gain the day, they will play again, and the pen be struck through the Liberals. Is this sport?—Yours, &c.,

SUGGESTED SINGLE-WICKET MATCH
AT CAMBRIDGE.

In the olden days, when single-wicket matches were played with more or less frequency, the greatest excitement was manifested and much money wagered as to the probable result, and it is with pleasure and a great deal of confidence, that we now—by special request—bring before the sporting fraternity of Cambridge a suggestion of a single-wicket cricket match between the following well-known Cambridge cricketers:—

Dan Hayward	Diver
Arthur Hayward	Carpenter, jun.
Tom Hayward	Watts, jun.

—It is suggested that this match be played on Parker's Piece, subject to the ordinary rules of single wicket matches, or such other rules as the players themselves might agree upon. Single-wicket matches have been but rarely indulged in of late years, but in the sixties they were of very frequent occurrence. Perhaps those best remembered by Cambridge people were the two promoted by Jackson, the well-known patron of the game, who in 1861 or 1862 backed Tom Hayward and Bob Carpenter to play a single-wicket match against any three players in England. The challenge was accepted by a Yorkshire man, who secured the services of three "Tykes," and the match was played at Stockton-on-Tees, and ended in Hayward and Carpenter winning with consummate ease. The following year was a notable one for cricketers, for the advent of Tarrant. Jackson again issued

a challenge to back Hayward, Carpenter, and Tarrant against any other five cricketers that could be produced in England. This match was also played at Stockton-on-Tees, and it is claimed that more interest was centred in the game than in any match previously played. About one hour before the game commenced—there being a great deal of money wagered, and the five being favourites—Hayward offered to back himself for £50 that he scored over 50 runs. The wager was accepted. The result of the game was that the three won. Hayward went to the wicket last and soon knocked up 52, and, having thus won the wager, retired.

We have simply been asked to ventilate this capital idea, and considering the amount of enthusiasm evinced in these matches years ago, we venture to predict that could such a one be promoted between prominent players, it would be highly interesting.

We regret to hear that the question of expense is likely to put a stop to the suggested single-wicket match between the three Haywards and Diver, Watts, and Carpenter. There ought to be no difficulty in raising the necessary funds for such an interesting event as the above would be.

There appears after all to be some prospect of this event being brought off, as, in consequence of Diver being expected to be in Cambridge very shortly, the item of railway expenditure can be avoided. We understand that Mr. Frank Waters will be asked to undertake the arrangements, and they certainly could not be in better hands. It is proposed that the three winners should each be presented with a first-class bat.
