

WORCESTERSHIRE CLUB AND GROUND v. REDDITCH AND DISTRICT LEAGUE.

Redditch has always been a prominent district in Worcestershire cricket, and it is not to be wondered at that the League were accorded a fixture with the Club and Ground. The match was played on the well-appointed ground of the Redditch Windsor Club, and a fairly strong County eleven was got together. They commenced with J. E. Perkins and W. Souch, and after Souch had been caught at short leg off his hand, F. Wheldon joined Perkins and brought on a double change of attack. Fifty went up for thirty minutes' play. J. E. Perkins was clean bowled at 72. With the Hon. F. E. Allsopp in, runs came freely, and the century went up for less than one hour's play, but at 107 Wheldon was caught off a lofty hit to leg for a very well played 41. The Hon. F. E. Allsopp soon hit up 43, and fell to a good catch at square leg ten runs later. Brierley was unfortunately run out. At the luncheon interval the score was 159 for six wickets. Rolleston followed in, and was bowled for a single, and the end soon came, the innings closing for 180. Redditch opened with H. F. Chambers and Layton. The former fell to Rolleston in his first over, while Layton was bowled by E. Perkins's first ball. F. Chambers did no better, and three were down for a cipher. Runs came slowly, and six were down for 35, when a change of bowling was tried, Brierley vice Rolleston, but proved expensive, as 15 were scored off two overs. E. Perkins clean bowled G. Chatterley next over. His analysis at this time being six wickets for 7 runs. Lamborchit very freely for 29, but no one else made any stand, and the venture closed for 67. Having to follow on, the home side did much better, as, although three wickets had fallen for 25, and four for 38, Messrs. Lambert and Pinfield played out time, when the score was 81 for four wickets. Rolleston, unfortunately, dislocated his little finger at practice, which somewhat interfered with his bowling.

WORCESTERSHIRE CLUB AND GROUND v. CATHEDRAL SCHOOL.

A rather late start was made, and the School, winning the toss, took up their defence with Messrs. Rammell and Chamberlain to the bowling of W. A. Young and Capt. How, but a dozen runs accruing from the latter's first over, H. W. Brierley was requisitioned. A smart catch at the wicket got rid of Rammell for a free 22. Runs still came freely, and a double change of bowling took place before Chamberlain was caught at cover point for a patient 21. Full score, 68 for two wickets. A lofty drive to long off caused the retirement of Beach Hicks; three for 73. The next wicket added little, but the brothers Bolland brought up three figures after little more than an hour's play. With the exception of a steady 19 by A. P. Bolland, not much more was done, and the innings closed for 135.

With an hour and three quarters to play Captain How and W. Pool went in for the Club and Ground. Both batsmen scored freely, and the first wicket fell at 46. H. Smith failed to score, clean bowled second ball, and Capt. Featherstonhaugh fell for a single. H. W. Brierley was nearly stumped—four wickets down for 55. Pool was well caught in the long field, and a short stand was made by Stokes and Young, when the former was splendidly thrown out, and six wickets were down for 82. WORCESTERSHIRE CLUB AND GROUND V. BROMSGROVE KING EDWARD'S SCHOOL.

The annual engagement against the above school ranks amongst the oldest fixtures of the County Club; and, as the boys have shown very good form during the present season, a fairly strong team of amateurs were arrayed against them at Boughton. It was after mid-day when the visitors arrived, and consequently a start was not practicable until half-past twelve. The Bromsgrovians were successful in the spin of the coin, and on a perfect wicket elected to defend, a start being made with the Rev. E. J. Houghton and Ley to the bowling of the Hon. F. E. Allsopp and Rev. H. F. Bennett. After a trio of maidens the Master was first to score with a couple of nice drives, and Ley out the Hon. F. Allsopp very nearly twice consecutively. Mr. Houghton out the same bowler finely for 4, and this proving expensive, E. Perkins went on at 24 and was hit to leg boundary in the fresh trundler's second over. A good delivery removed the Rev. E. J. Houghton's off stump at 35, and the Bromsgrove captain filled the vacancy. Ley, who had played very well, left at 41 from a smart catch behind the stumps. Hoskins gave little trouble, as he played on after getting three singles. Hadow, who came next, had a narrow escape from being run out, after which he hit a four to leg and a out for three consecutively. By very slow degrees the total had reached 61, when the Rev. M. B. Buckle superseded Perkins. From the first ball Hadow just touched the ball, and it reached the leg boundary. Bunting, who had been in 40 minutes for four singles, was cheered for a splendid out for which four were run. The Hon. F. Allsopp resumed bowling at 95, the stand at this period having put on 50 runs. Three figures went up on the board after an hour and twenty minutes play. An easy catch at the wicket off-keeper, Hadow's dismissal for a well-played score. The Rev. Bennett, who had sent down twenty overs without a rest, gave the ball to Bearcroft. No further loss occurred before the luncheon interval, the score standing at 119 for four wickets.

Upon resuming Bunting and J. Moore made a prolonged stand, and scored at a very equal rate. Frequent changes in bowling were tried, none of all sorts, even jobs, being resorted to without avail. Each batsman completed his half century amidst cheering. The second hundred went up at a quarter to four. The amount of leather hunting was now beginning to tell, as the fielding became very loose, and runs came at a very rapid rate, until at 271 a smart return from third man knocked down the stumps before Moore got back, although he gave a chance or two in the last quarter of an hour. The innings was a highly meritorious one, and it appeared a pity he could not complete his century, as he fully deserved it. The large number of 173 runs had been added since the fall of the previous wicket. Bunting, too, had every appearance of scoring his century, but he did not seem comfortable after Moore's departure, and a ball that broke in a great deal took both balls. His brilliant total included six 4's and eight 3's. The seventh wicket fell exactly at 300, and, after Bullard had scored 21 in less than ten minutes, the closure was adopted.

The Worcestershire side started badly when Perkins was sent back for a "duck." Poots and the Rev. MALVERN V. THE REST OF WORCESTER-SHIRE (12 A SIDES).

Probably no better fixture could possibly be arranged at the present time than one under the above title, for it was well known that a team could without difficulty be got in Malvern which could fairly cope with the other part of Worcestershire. Although the Malvernians appeared particularly strong in batting, the County side had the advantage in the bowling. The Malvern captain won the toss. Messrs. W. L. Foster and Marriott were the first to oppose the attacks of Rollings and Burrows. The last-named took Mr. Foster's middle stump with the second ball he sent down, and Mr. Marriott skied an easy one to mid on, which was secured, and the twain that made such a stand in the first match came together, viz., Messrs. Greenstock and Toppin. The total had reached 35 when Millward shared the bowling with Rollings, but the slow bowling was not attended by very brilliant fielding. Mr. Toppin was missed when he had scored 15, as he sent a lofty one to mid on, which should have been easily taken. Rollings had sent down a dozen overs when Firkins superseded him at 52, but the change did not have the desired effect, and Raynor was tried at 82. The century, however, went up, the result of seventy-five minutes' play without the stand being broken, until at 1.30 Rollings resumed, and sent Mr. Toppin back with a real twister from the off. The chief contributor was let off twice, and he batted splendidly afterwards. Seven hits for 4 were the chief items of his compilation. Mr. Greenstock had just exceeded the half century when the adjournment took place, he having Mr. Farrant for his partner.

Upon resuming each batsman scored at a very fast rate, as 50 came in half an hour. Soon after Millward resumed bowling, Mr. Greenstock stepped out to a slow one and paid the penalty. Edwards accomplished his overthrow in grand style. The Malvernian's fine score was obtained by faultless cricket, and included two 4's, nine 3's, and half a dozen 2's; and he was batting whilst 186 runs were scored, and was fully entitled to the cheering which followed his retirement. A smart catch at the wicket two overs later dismissed Mr. Farrant, who played a dashing innings, in which were only seven singles. Messrs. H. K. Foster and T. M. Pike gave the fielders a merry time, as they scored off nearly every ball, and a maiden over became quite a rarity until the pair had amassed 80, when a grand catch in the long field sent back Mr. Pike for a prettily played score. The third century was telegraphed at a quarter-past five, and Mr. Foster half an hour later completed his famous figure by brilliant cricket. He gave a palpable chance in the out field when he had made 91, but, with this exception, he batted in quite his old style. Included in his score were eight 4's and fourteen 3's. Willoughby was caught at mid-on, which brought the venture to a conclusion for the large total expended, which, considering the strength of the bowling, was a highly creditable performance. The County were only batting 15 minutes, and had just got double figures without loss when stumps were drawn.

SECOND DAY.

The thunderstorm of the night tended to make the wicket quite of a different nature from what it was during the Malvernian batting. Nevertheless it had wonderfully improved when Raynor and Edwards continued the first Worcestershire defence at a quarter to twelve. Each of the two over-night not out were easily caught at point, the score standing at 40 for two wickets. Millward was batting six overs for a couple of runs. Mr. Ashill never looked like getting many, and he was taken in the easiest way. Mr. Abell was caught in the slips without scoring, and five wickets were down at 50. Consecutive balls sent back Messrs. Carmichael and Isaac, with only 5 runs added. The fifth catch at point sent back Rollings, after staying whilst seven batsmen were dismissed. Bowley, although he scored slowly, showed a bold resistance and batted very well; and Mr. Firkins, who did not take long to rattle out double figures. Mr. Mansell, too, showed very good form. The innings closed at half-past one, Worcestershire, having the large adverse total of 267, of course had to follow on.

The order was entirely changed in the second innings, both in the defence and the attack, as Millward and Burrows opposed the deliveries of Messrs. H. K. Foster and H. B. Pike. The wicket, which had played very indifferent in the previous innings, had materially improved, and after luncheon was decidedly better. Each batsman punished the bowling to such an extent that a double change was tried at 45, Willoughby and Mr.

Simpson having charge of the trundling. The amateur proved very efficient the two overs he sent down, and Mr. Farrant took his place. In the latter's second over Millward was well caught at long off, the score having reached 58. Bowley opened with a snick through slips for five all run out, and was cheered when he hit Willoughby grandly to leg for three. He was soon afterwards taken from a lofty hit to long off. Burrows batted remarkably well until Mr. Toppin went on to bowl at 92, and a smart piece of fielding caused his wicket to be put down just as he had completed his half century. Edwards gave no trouble this time. Raynor hit freely, but got out in the same manner as in the previous innings. Three wickets now fell without a run, and seven were down at 123. Thirty were put on by Rollings and Mr. Isaac for the wicket, but a fine catch in the long field terminated the innings, the result being a victory for the Malvernians by an innings and 121 runs. BATTING AND BOWLING AVERAGES FOR SEASON 1893.

1st ELEVEN.

This club brought another most successful season to a close on Thursday week by winning the Hereford Challenge Trophy at Hereford, and the members are to be congratulated on the splendid record achieved. The first eleven have played 27 matches, resulting as follows:—20 won, 1 tie, 3 lost, and 3 drawn. St. John's scoring 3,580 runs for 234 wickets (average 15.30 per wicket), as against 1,960 runs for 269 wickets (average 7.32 per wicket) by opponents. The club has declared its innings closed on seven occasions, all of which resulted in victories, whilst its opponents have only declared once. Only on four occasions have the club's opponents succeeded in reaching the century, while St. John's has reached that figure no less than 19 times. The largest score made by the club was against Proteign (at Hereford), 276 for five wickets (innings declared), and the smallest 33, at Malvern. The largest score made against the club was 181 for seven wickets (innings declared) by Boughton Park, and the smallest 17, by Wolland and district. The batting and bowling averages show a marked improvement as compared with those of last season, seventeen batsmen having a double figure average as against seven last year. Mr. H. J. Perkins is the only bowler who has taken over fifty wickets; but Messrs. W. and D. Smith, Rice, Leggett, and Syche have all done some capital performance. The fielding of the eleven during the season has been excellent, the captain especially distinguishing himself in this department of the game. The club is to be congratulated on winning the Hereford Challenge Cup, and during the competition St. John's scored 688 runs for thirty wickets, an average of 23 runs per wicket, to their opponents 347 runs for forty wickets, showing an average of 8½ runs per wicket. The averages given below are for five innings and over for batsmen and ten wickets and over for bowlers; but it may be stated that no less than 54 different members have taken part in first eleven and 46 in second eleven matches. The new pavilion has proved a great convenience to the members and also the visiting teams.
