BEDFORD V. KETTERING.

This match was played on the Goldington-road ground on Whit-Monday, and a capital wicket had been prepared by Watson. Kettering opened the batting and lost three wickets for 18 runs. At 38 Gill joined Scott, and these two raised the total to 71 for the fifth wicket. P. Stockburn was the only other player to do anything of note. Bedford also started badly, losing two wickets for 11 runs, but then Vipian and Weiss carried the total to 33 before the former left. Watson was in fine form and made the top score of the day. He and Weiss put on 33 for the fourth wicket, and Evans did defensive work while he got more runs, the total being 91 when the partnership was dissolved. Another good stand was made by Poole and Wright, who put on 33 for the seventh wicket, but the last three wickets cost only 4 runs. For Kettering, Hutchens took 4 wickets for 46 runs, and Panter 3 for 47; while for Bedford Weiss took 5 for 49 in the first innings and 3 for 16 in the second, and Spencer 3 for 23. The partnership of Scott and Neilson in Kettering's second innings commenced with the score at 42, and they played out time. Bedford won on the first innings by 23 runs.

Rushden won the toss and elected to bat first, sending in Colson and Knight to face the bowling of W. F. Brown and Ocle. Colson hit with vigour and, despite bowling changes, at luncheon he was not out 37, out of a total of 48, with two wickets down, both of which fell to "W. F." On resuming, Colson and Sartoris opposed the bowling of W. F. Brown and Edwards, the latter going on vice Ocle. After two or three maiden overs a single from Colson put 50 up. Three more having been added, the Northamptonshire pro. was caught in the slips by L. G. Brown for a well-played 40 (3 for 53). Sartoris was now partnered by G. H. Claridge, and the former was soon beaten by Edwards (4 for 56). Fields-Clarke now made his appearance, and after a few runs had been scored, the game was interrupted by rain. Resuming, the new comer was splendidly caught near the ground by A. D. Piper (5 for 79). Dickinson joined Claridge, and the field had a lively few minutes until the former succumbed to Edwards (6 for 86). C. R. Claridge then joined his brother, and they were together when the century was telegraphed, but G. H. was bowled directly afterwards by W. F. Brown without any addition to the score (7 for 100). C. Claridge and C. R. Claridge became associated, and the former was dismissed by W. F. Brown's first ball (8 for 103). Vann was next in and he was also clean bowled with his first ball from W. F. Brown, who thus performed the "hat-trick" (9 for 103). Brown was the last man in, and C. R. Claridge gave a chance in the long field to Potter, who had to run a considerable distance for it. Runs came moderately fast and Potter and Ocle went on to bowl. Claridge gave a sharp return to Potter, but it was not taken. However, Ocle secured Brown's wicket in his second over, and the innings closed for 127. W. F. Brown took 6 wickets for 53 runs, Edwards 3 for 47, Ocle 1 for 18, and Potter none for 4 runs.

WATSON'S BENEFIT MATCH.

This match, after being postponed a week on account of rain, came off on the Goldington-road ground last Saturday, the teams being an Eleven representing the Town Club and Eighteen Colts selected from various junior clubs in Bedford. Although there were only three or four hundred visitors on the ground, this was a good attendance for a Bedford cricket match, but had it not been for the private subscriptions of members and patrons of the Town Club, the match would have resulted in very little "benefit" to Watson, who has rendered good service to the Club as their professional for three years. The result was a draw, although much in favour of the Town, as with only two wickets to fall the Colts were over one hundred behind. The large score amassed by the Town was without any doubt due to the rather loose fielding of the Colts, as in Brown's 101 he was let off above once, and they were rather unfortunate as when he had made nine the ball hit the wicket but did not dislodge the balls. But on the whole the young players played a good all-round game, and some of the fielding was admirable, J. Taylor, Legge, Whiteman, and Flitton, and one or two others being especially good. If the Town had declared earlier, there is no doubt they would have won easily, but it was thought desirable to let J. G. Brown complete his century if possible, as soon as he had done which the innings was declared. The young players made a splendid effort, and in scoring 132 for 15 wickets against the redoubtable Tom Brown and "W. F.," they and their Clubs can be congratulated. Before the match commenced the photos of the Colts, the umpire, and scorer were taken. J. Taylor, captain of the Colts, won the toss but had to put the Town in as only five of the latter team were on the ground at the time fixed for the start. Baiting operations were commenced by Watson and Brown (a County player and professional at Lords), G. Carter taking charge of the wicket. The bowling of Dennis and Flitton was freely knocked about, but with the score at 23 Flitton in his third over disposed of Watson. L. G. Brown partnered his namesake, and in the third over of Sharwood—who had taken the ball from Dennis—he had a narrow escape, the ball touching the wicket but failing to dislodge the bail. Cricket was tame for a time, but then both batsmen began to hit with vigour and brought about several changes in the bowling, Lenton, Cherry, and J. Taylor all having a try. At 81 Cherry brought about the desired separation, Brown going out to meet a ball and missing it. Rogers (the Modern School pro.) had had enough with four balls from Taylor, and Cherry (the Grammar School pro.) found the second ball from his brother one too many for him. These two wickets cost only one run, and Eicke stayed while five more were added. Beasley was with L. G. Brown when the century was telegraphed after an hour and a half's play, and this partnership for the sixth wicket put on 21 runs. Ocle and L. G. Brown caused a lot of leather hunting, and in spite of several bowling changes they raised the score from 108 to 197. Godfrey also played in dashing style, and after L. G. Brown had completed his century the innings was declared closed. With two hours to play, the Colts started their venture with J. Taylor and Dennis against the bowling of W. F. Brown and Brown, and L. G. Brown was wicket-keeper. In Brown's first over Taylor had the misfortune to be run out. Whiteman assisted Taylor but the next five players gave little trouble. Pilgrim and Legge made a good stand, carrying the score from 49 to 73, and causing Ocle to go on bowling vice Brown. Sims assisted Pilgrim to put on 18 for the 13th wicket, and Tucker also played grandly and carried out his bat with the top score of the innings.
