No. 8.—MR. HARRY BARNEY (Reading Wednesday C.C.).

Mr. Barney, from a cricket point of view, is possessed of a most interesting history. His first introduction to the grand old game took place in the Harbadoes, Weat Indies, while serving with the 49th Royal Berka Regiment. Here for twelve months he was playing with and against the "niggers" almost every day, with the result that when he returned to Portsmouth in 1899 he had developed into a fairly sound hat. In regimental matches he did aplendidly, and at the end of the season had the pleasure of topping the batting averages. About this time the Boor War broke out, and Intry volunteering, he shortly after sailed for South Africa on board the "Dunottar Castle," the boat which also carried General Buller and Staff. During the voyage out an impromptu sports niceting was held, and out of a programme of eight events Mr. Barneys annexed five first prizes and one second. After six months in South Africa Hurry was invalided home, and sport the cricket season he played several times for the promier club of the town, while on certain accasions he figured for three-lands in the First Division of the Reading and District Cricket League. Both are worthy champions, and their records are very similar, for each won every League match save one. The death of King Edward VII. caused the abandonment of the first meeting between the Reading and Newbury Leagues, but when the teams met on August Bank Holiday Reading had to acknowledge defeat at Palmer Park.

Wesley, who had the great advantage of the captainey of the Rev. A. H. Lowe, were good all round, and their only defeat of the season was administered by the Magpies at Wokingham. Their batting was good, and the side which got them out for less than 100 runs could consider themselves fortunate. The averages, which are printed separately in another column, show that E. Hall, who twice exceeded the half-century and proved himself a stylish and attractive batsman, was the most successful of Wosley's wielders of the willow. Claud Newman—I suppose he will not mind my speaking of him as a veteran—is second on the list, with G. Page, A. E. Tice, C. Martin, W. G. Lowe, A. H. Lowe and C. H. Tice all having averages of over ten per innings. W. G. Lowe's value as a first wicket batsman was even greater than the figures show. Good batting performances have been credited to J. French, H. G. Taylor, T. L. Taylor, T. Coddard, E. Phipps and J. Webb have done some notable things, French against Stoke Row capturing six for 18.
