CARMARTHEN v. MONMOUTH.

SILVERLOCK SCORES 112 AND DOES THE "HAT TRICK."

Carmarthenshire, who have become accustomed to decisive defeats, were beaten once more by Monmouthshire to the tune of an innings and 43 runs. This is just what was anticipated. All the county matches in which Carmartheashire participate are regarded as Carmarthenshire participate are regarded as foregone conclusions, because they almost invariably get a sound tronneing and occasionally the many border on the Indictors. The chief reason for this is the absence of "pro." bowlers from the ranks of the Carmarthenshire team, and until a change in this direction is brought about then they will have to grin and hear the punishments so mercilessly inflicted upon them. In their match with Monmonthshire, which was played at Stradey on Monday and Tuesday, they managed to lessen the guif between their scores and that of Monmonthshire as compared with the corresponding encounter of last senson, but beyond this there was not very much to derive consolation from.

Monmonthshire, who went in first on a slow wicket in ampromising weather, had their innings opened by Silverlock and A. M. Matthy, who faced the bowling of Gravelle and E. Gee first of all. Both intsmen hit out freely when contending with Gravelle, and the other change bowlers, but they, along with the other batsmen dared not take liberties with E. Gee. The first partnership realised 127 runs, but before Silverlock, who eventually scored 112, had reached his half century, he gave a chance to Hugh Howell, which was not taken. When the Llanelly vice-captain went on to bowl he was severely punished by Silverlock, whose total included 2 sixes, 14 fours, and 10 twos, but a few minutes later he clean heat Maltby, and in the same over E. S. Phillips was disposed of by him before he scored a single run. When Diver appeared at the wicket, 200 had been signalled. After scoring six runs Diver failed to resist the temptation of leaving his crease to take a smack at Gee, and he thus gave Will Davies a rare chance of stumping him. To the surprise of everyone the Llanelly stumper, who is usually so alert, mulled the hall, and the chance was lost. After this Diver hit out freely, carrying his total to 58 before being dismissed by Gee, who was easily the most effective bowler on the Carmarthenshire side. The Llanelly left-hand bowler in 30 overs had nine maldens to his credit, and captured five wickets for 68 runs. Monmonthshire's total was carried to 297, when the last wicket fell at 4.30.

The Curmarthenshire innings was opened by Ike Evans and Percy Ross, who faced the bowling of F. G. Phillips and Silverlock. The Llanelly captain, after contributing 16 runs, was stumped by Diver off Silverlock, and his place was taken by Hugh Howell, who, along with Evans, made a splendid stand. During their stay at the wicket a couple of changes were made in the bowling, and when Howell's total stood at 21 he met with a similar fate as Percy Ross. A little later Evans, who scored at a good pace, was well bowled by F. G. Phillips after contributing 40 runs. Five wickets had fallen when stumps were drawn for 105 runs.

On Tuesday morning the game was resumed in unsettled weather. Heavy showers of rain had fallen over-night, and when play was restarted those was a very strong wind blowing. G. Gravelle and A. P. James, who had scored 11 and 6 respectively, when the adjournment was made, faced the bowling of Watkins and Stodman. In the third over, which was taken by Silverlock, Gravelle was demissed and Hubort John bacame associated with James, who was batting remarkable well. The accretary of the Carmarthenshira team had only scored two runs when he was

caught out by Malthy off Stedman. Eventually A. P. James, who contributed 41 runs, was caught and bowled by Silverlock. Two more wickets having fallen to the lot of Stedman, all the Carmarthenshire men were out for 156 runs, thus being 141 runs behind their

Carmarthenshire followed on and after the first four butsmen had been disposed of the others, with the exception of Will Davies, collapsed completely before the bowling of Silverlock, who found the wicket to his liking. In the first innings he secured six wickets for 54 runs, but he was far more effective in the second innings, when he captured eight wickets for 27 runs, and performed the "hat trick." Will Davies made the best stand for Carmarthenshire in the second innings, contributing 24 runs of the total of 98 which included 21 extras. It would hardly be fair to pass unnoticed Monmouthshire's stumper, imsmuch as in addition to scoring 58 runs, he stumped no less than four of the Carmarthenshire players out. Scores:

Thursday's play was much interfered with by rain, cricket being limited to three hours and three-quarters. In that time the home side made 191 for nine wickets, but except for the play of Tarrant and More the cricket was almost featureless. Warner helped to give the side a splendid start, batting 15 minutes for 39 and helping to make 97 for the first wicket, but the total was only 191 when the fourth wicket fell. Seven men were out for 182, but Anson and More by adding 58 in an hour redeemed some of the failures. In order that P.
