Marked progress was made in the match between Staffordshire and Notts vesterday, when an aggregate score of 259 was registered for 24 wickets. On the first innings Mafford-shire held an advantage of 16 runs, but this adverse balance was early removed when Notts embarked upon their second innings an hour and a quarter before close of play last night. The same order as in the first innings was resorted to and before James and Armstrong

sorted to and before James and Armstrong were parted they had wiped off the deficiency and put on a matter of nine rune. Deves and Barnes chared the attack at the outset, but eventually Vost and Bucknell were introduced, and when studings were drawn Notts had lost four wickets for 69.

Stapleton and Whosall resumed shortly after eleven pelock this morning, Bucknell and Barnes making up the attack.
