The pair carried the score from 29 for two to 183 for three. Ashley did not long survive and then Hendren and A. F. Walker, the Darlington man, carried the score from 218 to 305. These were the best stands of the day.

When Thackeray was caught by Richardson, the last man on the home side. Durham were leading by 410 runs. There was a sporting chance that Northumberland might by able to play from 2.40 until 6.30, but the team collapsed utterly, and were all out at a quarter past four for 111 runs, Durham winning by 299 runs.
