Warwickshire, going in again, made 204 for six wickets before stumps were drawn. Lilley, hitting a 6 and eight 4's, made 67 in 110 minutes, whilst Quaffe, batting steadily, was in for nearly two hours and a-half for 60: together they put on 85 for the third wicket. During the innings Morton obtained his 100th wicket of the season. On the third morning the innings closed for 221, leaving Derbyshire 294 to wim—a task they never seemed likely to accomplish.
