Champain, Gloucestershire had the best of the opening day's play, dismissing the visitors for 192 and then scoring 140 for two wickets. On a wicket affected to some extent by rain, Dennett took six wickets for 105 runs, after his analysis at the interval had been one for 84. Seymour and Smith each batted 70 minutes for 51, and in partnership put on 76 for the tilird wicket. That the small total of 192 was not due wholly to the state of the wicket was shown when Gloucestershire went in, for after a first-wicket stand of 55, which lasted only 28 minutes, Salter and Brownlee put on 64 by the end of the day without being parted. The stand for the third wicket was not dissolved on Taosday until it had realised 91 in 65 minutes. Salter was then out after batting an hour and a-half for a faultless innings of 68. The opposing total was passed without further loss, but Jessop was bowled after making 20 out of 33 in 15 minutes, and half the side were out for 211. Brownlee, seventh out (at 230°, made his 68 in 115 minutes—a very lacky innings indeed seeing that he was missed five times. Halnes and Cranfield reached double-figures and the home side obtained a lead of 78. During the imings Thompson took eight wickets for 114 runs not withstanding that the field gave him poor support. Northants, going in the second time, soon lost Vials, but Seymour and Tyler had taken the score to 42 without further loss when rain put an end to the days play.
