Cruwys, in attempting a short run was nearly thrown out by Frith, who hit the stumps with a fine return. Soon after the bateman hit the hundredith run. At this period the Bucks bowling appeared to have little sting, and slowly the home scare was approached, though 14 runs were wanted to equal it when Cruwys infringed rule 24, and retired for a like animber of runs. A hard drive by Sturt was well attempted by Lowndes, who got his left hand to the ball, but could not hold the clustre sphere, and then the Bucks total was passed. There was no strength in the Devon tail, and at 5.20. Page wound the innings up by a brilliant return, which ran Christian out, Devon holing 23 nhead. Frith had the best analysis (four for 39), Vickerstaffe claiming three for 31, and Page and Wright each having a wicket. Keen bowled with bard-luck, whilat the wicket-keeping of Davies and E. A. Shaw was smart in the extreme.

In 1876-7 Hill visited Australia as a member of Lillywhite's team, and in the course of the trip took 113 wickets, all but three of the matches, however, being against odds. It was during that tour that England and Australia first met on even terms—at Melbourne, in March—and Hill always spoke most highly of Charles Bannerman's innings of 165 not out, saying that he had never seen finer batting—a very great compliment indeed seeing that he had witnessed many of "W.G.'s" best innings when the Champion was in his prime.
