

SUFFOLK v. CAMBRIDGESHIRE.

Fine weather prevalled at Felixatowe on Friday, when this match was commenced. Much interest was manifested in the game, for winning meant to Suffolk that they would very probably top, their division. The match was concluded, and after a most exciting finish ended in favour of the home County by the narrow margin of two wickets. Suffolk on the opening day had established a lead of a century, but so well did Hayward and Bocock, the opening hatsmen, meet the sttack that before a separation was effected, the arrears were only three, Bocock being run out at dy. Further success attended the visiting batsmen, and when the ninth wicket fell (C Pigg was unable to bat on account of a sprained leg) Suffolk were set 173 to get to win. They found runs difficult to get against the bowling of Coulson, but I Ireland, Raynor, Phillips, and Bird batted finely, and about three minutes before time K G Ireland made the winning hit amid loud cheering, Suffolk winning as stated. By this victory Suffolk have secured 28 of a possible 40 points in the Championship competition. They have played eight games, of which they have won five outright and one on the first innings. They have lost one game, and were in arrears in another on the first innings. It is significant that the whole of the 28 points lave been obtained in the last six matches. Pull score:—
