Laverton was quickly dismissed and his place was taken by E. Newman. Trotman was missed at point, and later both he and Newman were let off in the slips. Haikes and Williams, the former at 18 and the latter at 28, relieved Silverlock and Phillips respectively. They, however, resumed after a few overs. Trotman was eventually taken in the slips, the partnership having produced 71 runs. A. Newman falled to reach double figures, and J. R. Taylor then juned E. Newman and both played very skiifully. After ninety minutes play they sent up the 100, and they continued to but with great freedom up to the luncheon interval, when the score was 124 for three wickets. Wiltshire gave promise of making a heavy score, but the interregnum of the mid-day repast has often beer followed with disaster, and this was the experience of the home representatives. E. Newman was caught in the slips without adding to his score. Going in at the fall of the first wicket, ie assisted in adding 125 to the score in 105 minutes, his own contribution being practically one-half that number. R. W. Awdry started well with a good stroke to the boundary, but with the next ball he was defeated by Phillips, who had a remarkable record, taking six wickets at the trifling cost of 8 runs. After luncheon the remaining seven wickets were disposed of in half-an-hour, the innings having lasted two hours and ten minutes for 151. The feature of the Mommouth innings was the urilliant batting of Silverlock, E. S. Philipy, and Diver, who, between them, and "Mr. Ex-ras" were credited with 196 out of a grand total of 232, which were obtained in two hours and fity m nutes. The weather on Saturday morning was not propititious, a drizzling rain falling till about noon, and and it was not until twenty minutes past twelve that a start was made. A. M. Miller (13) and A Nowman (7), the not outs at the close of the previous day's play, resum d their lunings opposed by Phillips and W. A. Williams. The captain hit in his usual resolute style, but at 57 a splendid ball from Phillips knocked with the middle. W.A. Williams. At 84 Williams retired in favour of Raikes. 100 appeared on the board, 43 runs having been made in twenty minutes. Silverlock displaced Raikes at 113, and the change met with success, for in his first over he dismissed Newman. The partnership produced 80, the retring bataman's contribution of 39, including seven 4's and one 3. E. C. Laverton met with no better luck than he did in the first innings; he had only just opened his account when Silverlock claimed him also as one of his victims. J. R. Taylor joined Awdry and they remained together till the luncheon interval, when the score was 128 for the loss of five wickets. This excellent start was not maintained when played was resumed. Phillips at this stage of the game, as on the previous day, bowled with effect, and with one exception took all the wickets. Taylor was caught in the slips, and Trotman failed to score. Awdry, who went in at the fall of the third wiket, was eighth out with the score at 157. He gave one of his best displays, and sent the ball nine times to the boundary. The remaining two wickets only produced 10, and the innings, which lasted two hours and a quarter, closed for 167.

Monmouth required 87 to win, and these were obtained as the result of seventy minutes play and the loss of two wickets. Stratton was out to a brilliant catch by the bowler, A. Newman, who took the ball quite close to the ground. Silverlock was caught by Awdry at 59, and the remainder of the runs were obtained in twenty minutes by E. S. Phillips and Diver. Scores:—

Surrey gained a winning advantage on the first day when, after dismissing the home side in an hour and three-quarters for 94, they scored 302 for six wickets in three and a-quarter hours. The Leicestershire men were evidently under the impression that the wicket would become more difficult as the day advanced, and in an endeavour to score quickly lost all their wickets cheaply. Sharp and Coe added 28 in 40 minutes, the former hitting two 6's in his 33 and the latter carrying out his bat for 15. Holbs batted superbly for Surrey, although missed when 73, and in making 116 out of 198 in 135 minutes hit two 6's and thirteen 4's with Hayward he made 66 in an hour and with Hayes 132 in 75 minutes. There was a heavy downfall of rain in the night, but a drying wind enabled play to be resumed just before four o clock on Friday. During the 150 minutes play was in progress Surrey completed their innings for an addition of 57 and got four Leicestorshire wickets down for 198. Campbell batted admirably for an hour and a-quarter, but he might have been caught at long-on when 42. The home side made a poor start upon poing in the second time, losing Wood at 25, Whitehead at 34 and Coe at 42. Then, however, Sharp and Knight added 27 and the latter and Crawford 39 without further loss. Knight gave an extremely good display and carried out his bat for 60 at the end of the day. Crawford was bowled on the third day with only 2 runs added and with none else reaching double-figures the match was concluded by ten minutes past twelve. Knight played a most skilful innings on a bowlers' wicket, scoring 73 in two hours and hitting two 6's and five 4's. Score and analysis:—
