

## The Coming Cricket Season.

### HITCHIN C. C.

A. Stephen, formerly of Ashwell and last season at Chatteris, will assist the Hitchin club this summer, and his presence is likely to prove of great benefit to the eleven. Its supporters, however, will be sorry to hear that K. C. Grellet's services will not often be available, this fine all-round cricketer and late captain of the club having, we are informed, accepted an appointment as coach at the Oval. Otherwise the eleven will be very much the same as in 1910, when the club enjoyed a very fair measure of success. The engagements for the season seem likely to provide a good deal of interest, but it unfortunately happens that there will be no home match between July 1 and August 7, owing to a succession of away engagements occurring in the former month. The county match on the 13th and 14th will to some extent compensate for this long break, but not entirely. ### NORTH HERTS. AND DISTRICT CRICKET LEAGUE.

The League programme will be shorter this year by 26 matches, consequent upon the number of the clubs taking part being reduced from eight to seven. In other words, each club will play 12 games instead of 14, as before. The reduction in the membership is to be regretted, because as it stood before it was none too large; one sometimes felt that interest in the League would be enhanced by increasing the number to nine or ten. We do not know whether the replacement of only one of the two clubs who dropped out is in accordance with the views of the executive—some slight curtailment of expenses will, of course, result from the reduced number—or whether there was only one suitable applicant for inclusion in the League. In place of Biggleswade and Henlow, we shall now see Hitchin St. Mary's C.C. taking part in the competition for the challenge shield. The present holders of this trophy, it need scarcely be said, are the Baldock club, who last season won their way to the position twice previously occupied by Biggleswade. The other former members of the League still competing are Hitchin Blue Cross Brigade, Ashwell, Arlesey, Stevenage E.S.A., and Stotfold. The champions are among the four clubs which start their League fixtures on the first Saturday in May; thus their admirers will early have an opportunity of ascertaining their "form" and their chance of retaining the shield. Hitchin St. Mary's, the newcomers, do not enter the field before May 20; it is understood that they will have a useful side. We are glad to hear that the League executive has quite a long list of neutral umpires who will officiate this summer, so there is a good prospect of the campaign being gone through without disputes due to allegations of partial and inefficient umpiring.

## NOTES.

Both League matches on Saturday were interesting, and one especially so, no doubt, to the friends of Hitchin Blue Cross Brigade, because its result placed the club at the head of the table for the first time this season. Although beaten by Baldock, Hitchin St. Mary's are still relatively ~~not~~ best off to the leaders, having two games ~~in~~ hand as compared with Arlesey and Stevenage E. S. A. and being but one point behind them. The Brigade's victims were Ashwell, who after a promising start at Stevenage, have lost four matches in succession, three on their own ground. One point for five games is a very poor record for a club which in previous seasons has finished well up in the table. On the other hand, the champions, who began by losing three games off the reel, have won three and drawn one of their five subsequent engagements, and on recent form must be considered as well in the running for this year's honours.

The champions' form against Hitchin St. Mary's was convincing enough to satisfy their most exacting critic-friend. The vigour with which the fall of their eleven wagged doubtless reflects the players' thankfulness at not having H. Williams bowling against them; but the visiting eleven was by no means a weak one, and the winners are entitled to credit for the big margin of 102 runs in their favour. Although Warren batted well for 31, the earlier part of the Baldock innings gave no promise of producing more than an ordinary total, the wickets up to the seventh falling respectively at 21, 27, 41, 55, 64, 75 and 75. Then Scoot and Gill added 24 runs, nearly all of which were made by the former; and after the ninth wicket had fallen at 106, Gill hit out lustily with Pettengell as his partner. The stand for the last wicket produced no fewer than 59 runs, which, speaking from memory, we should say creates a League record.

White and Haughton appear to have been kept on much too long, for while the former secured only one wicket for 58 runs and the latter one for 28, other of the St. Mary's bowlers had excellent figures: for example, Stevens, who before being taken off bowled fourteen overs and took four wickets for 27 runs. That the visitors could ill afford to give anything away by poor use of their bowling strength was speedily seen after their own innings began. Gage and Allen scored 26 for the first wicket, but once Baldock had separated this pair their task was easy in the extreme. Slater and King stayed awhile and increased the score by 14, but each of the other wickets fell without appreciable addition to the total. Gentle and Dodkin dismissed nine men between them, one left-hander claiming five victims for 23 runs and the other four for 17—both excellent records.

In his innings of 31 (scored out of 41 during his brief stay at the wicket) Warren hit one 6 and five 4's. Gill also hit a 6 and eight 4's were included in his total of 48. The latter player hit 14 off one over of White's. The Baldock fielding was keen and good. The visitors very nearly succeeded in drawing the game, less than five minutes' time remaining when Reeve, going on a second time at Dodkin's end, bowled Slater with his second ball.

The game at Ashwell produced no individual batting performance of exceptional merit. Four of the Brigade team and two of the home side made double figures, and M. Foster's 18 for the former was the highest effort in run-getting. But it did produce one remarkable bowling feat, this being E. A. Moss's of capturing nine wickets in the Brigade's innings. It was really unkind of his captain, going on to bowl late in

the innings, should have got the ninth wicket and so robbed the slow bowler of the honour of taking all ten. Bailey's intervention, however, was brought about by a seventh wicket stand during which the total of the home side was passed. The tail-end of the Brigade eleven was the more successful, as in the case before instanced, and it was mainly the result of a last-wicket stand by Basterfield and Anderson which raised the visitors' majority to the respectable figure of 57. Moss's nine wickets cost 45 runs, and his feat has, we believe, only once been equalled since the League was formed.

Games between Hitchin and Luton are usually productive of big scores, and Saturday's meeting of the clubs proved no exception. An individual three-figure innings made the batting on both sides notable. The Luton "centurion" was A. E. Durrant, who made 101 not out, hitting thirteen 4's in the process. The home captain closed the innings with the total 291 for four wickets, but if hope was entertained that the visitors would be got out in the couple of hours or so remaining it was quickly dispelled. Woodhouse and Stephen scored 44 for the first wicket, and although Hull once again failed to get into double figures for Hitchin, he stayed while 23 runs were added. Cox, for the most part looking on while Stephen sent the score along, left at 106, and a longer partnership between the latter and Williams succeeded. Sixty-four were put on for the fourth wicket, which was the last the Luton bowlers captured, Stephen and Brown playing out time and raising the Hitchin total to 216. The result was thus a very even draw.

Stephen, who had had very bad luck hitherto with his new club, had a chance to show his real ability against Luton and he took full advantage of it. His innings was a fine all-round exhibition of batting, and it was one of the most opportune of his many big scores. But for his success, the visitors, with a weak tail, would have been hard pressed to save the game. They felt the absence of their usual wicketkeeper rather severely, as many as five balls going to the boundary for 4 byes. In Stephen's 108 the chief hits were one 5, twelve 4's, three 3's, and eight 2's. There was some free hitting in the Luton innings by Brown and Ball, each of whom got eight 4's.

One is hardly ever tired of hearing of the doings of the grand old men of cricket, and we feel sure our readers will be much interested by the information to which this remark is the prelude. Against Napsbury Asylum for St. Albans last Saturday W. T. Westell played a splendid innings of 67. He has only failed to obtain double figures on two occasions this season. He will be 60 years of age in December. St. Albans Cricket Club, we are told, was the first club of which any record exists in the history of the game. It has been founded nearly 250 years, and Mr. Westell's father, himself, and his son (W. P. Westell, of Letchworth) have all been secretary of the club. "W. T." commenced playing for St. Albans 1st XI when he was 15 and made 56 against Cambridge Victoria on Bernard's Heath, the old county ground and scene of some of the greatest cricketing triumphs in Hertfordshire. It was on this ground, also, that he scored 188 against Essex. When 18 years old he was first bowled for the county. He then bowled very fast, and the present headmaster of Uppingham School, the Rev. Harry Mackenzie, was wicket-keeper. He was coach for some years at Winchester and Bedford Grammar School, and among others whom he coached was E. H. D. Sewall, who played such a fine innings for the M. C. C. at Lords a few weeks ago.

William Westell, the veteran "W.T.'s" father, was one of three brothers, sons of William Westell, of Oxford, who migrated to St. Albans. Joseph and Thomas were good cricketers. The last-named was the county and a first-class umpire for many years. But William was easily the best cricketer of the three brothers mentioned. He was considered by competent critics to be one of the straightest bowlers in England and was never known to bowl a wide! In the early sixties, playing on the old Etou and Middlesex ground at Primrose Hill, he bowled five men out in six balls, and the ball is now in the possession of the family, suitably inscribed. William Westell played against All England on the old Verulam Cricket Club's ground at St. Albans, and distinguished himself by taking all ten wickets in the second innings of England. He was not a great batsman, but possessed a sound defence.

While able to spare but little time from his engrossing work as author-naturalist to the national pastime, W. Percival Westell, of Letchworth, is a not unworthy successor to these cricketing giants of other days. On July 1 he played a capital innings against St. Ippolyts for the Garden City club. He made only 18 (the top score), but rescued the side from a breakdown. Again, on July 5, he saved the Wednesday XI against Shillington. Shillington

batted first and made 50. Churcher and Westell opened the innings for Letchworth and made 36 for the first wicket. On Churcher's dismissal a regular procession ensued, until seven wickets were down for 46. Westell still plodded on, and eventually carried his bat right through the innings, scoring 42 out of a total of 70.

In the match between the Stevenage club and Mr. Berger's XI a ball was knocked 47 yards. Litchfield was bowling at the time. This probably constitutes a local record. The nearest remembered approach to this on the Stevenage club ground is A. A. James's feat of some years ago, the distance in that instance being 42 yards.
