MINOR COUNTIES' CHAMPIONSHIP.

Cambridgeshire v. Lincolnshire.
LINCOLNSHIRE WIN BY 196 RUNS.

This match was opened at Ely on Tuesday, in brilliant weather, the heat being tempered by a nice breeze. Lincolnshire won the toss, and went to the wickets first, facing the bowling of B. W. Pigg and Coulson. Owing to the former's admirable work, Lincs. could not make very much headway. The principal scorer was C. Hallam, who made two 6's off Coulson's eleventh over and sent up the century. The Lincs. score totalled 108, B. W. Pigg and Coulson having bowled without a change. The fielding of the Cambs. men was excellent.

Cambs. started their venture with F. E. Collier and W. C. Hunt, the bowlers being Riley at the Deacon's-lane end and Broughton at the pavilion end. From the outset runs came briskly, four 4's being hit in the first two overs, of which three were placed to the credit of Hunt. This speedy run-getting induced the Lincs. captain to change the bowling, and Neville, who went on in place of Broughton, dismissed Collier with his second ball. He had contributed eight to the total of 22. With Hunt and Ling together the score rose rapidly, both batsmen indulging in some sharp running. Half a century was registered after about 20 minutes' play, but shortly afterwards Hunt, who had reached 27, was caught by Foster off Neville. H. C. Tebbutt and Ling, and the pair were still together at the call for lunch, the latter having scored 19 and the former 5.

When the game restarted after the interval, Day went on in place of Neville, Riley bowling as before at the Deacon's-lane end. After a few minutes' play Riley captured Ling's wicket, and in the next over H. C. Tebbutt fell a victim to Day, this making 59 for four wickets down. Whybro, who had been missed twice in the slips—once off each bowler—was beaten by Riley after adding only four to the total, and when 90 had been registered the same bowler got rid of Pigg in his making a bold stroke for a boundary hit. G. A. Rose parried a W. Pigg ball, who shortly afterwards was bowled by a no-ball from Riley. Rose came somewhat freely for a time, and with Rose hitting Day for six, the century was reached amidst applause. The partnership was dissolved at 118, Watts falling to Day, who had not seemed really comfortable with his deliveries. Rose divided the honour of the highest score with W. C. Hunt, each having scored 27. The former, who was beaten by Riley, had included three 4's and one 6 in his contribution. Coulson made 18 runs, and the other two batsmen—C. Pigg and A. Todd—failed to score. The innings closed for 144, giving Cambs. a lead of 36. After lunch there had been no change of bowling, which was shared by Riley and Day.

It was nearly 4 o'clock when Lincs. began their second innings, B. W. Pigg sharing the attack with Coulson, as in the first innings. Only a single run had been obtained when C. Millington was given out l.b.w. to Coulson, but the score was subsequently increased to 47 for three. C. L. Prior contributing 28 and D. P. Neville 14. When Thompson and Day got together run-getting became frequent, and at 77 a change of bowling was tried, Rose going on in place of Pigg. The century was registered after about one hour's play, and as the batsmen continued to make things lively other changes of bowling were tried, and eventually Hunt was responsible for Day's dismissal, the latter having added 38 runs. Broughton then joined Thompson, and the pair took the score from 123 to 188, the former contributing 39. The not out were Hallam (14) and Thompson (92), the latter, who was at the wickets for two hours, having played faultless cricket. At the drawing of stumps the Lincs. total had reached 263 for six wickets—227 runs ahead of the Cambs. score.

Play was resumed on Wednesday in brilliant weather, similar to that of the previous day. Lincolnshire increased the overnight score in their second innings to 330. W. Thompson had played a brilliant innings of 122, and the only chance he gave was taken by F. E. Collier, which sent him to the pavilion.

Cambridgeshire opened their innings at 12 o'clock, and started very badly, W. C. Hunt and Ling being clean bowled by Riley with the first two balls. This sensation was increased by H. C. Tebbutt, who had joined Collier, being caught from Riley's fifth ball. Matters went from bad to worse, F. E. Collier being dismissed by Day, who was bowling from the pavilion end. With only two overs sent down, four wickets had collapsed, the telegraph board showing the picture of 1-4-0 (the first figure representing a wide). The partnership of H. V. Whybro and B. W. Pigg broke to some extent the monotony, three fours being hit off Riley's third over, whereas the first had secured three wickets. When 30 runs had been added the fourth ball Whybro was smartly captured at cover point. After Broughton's one over Riley returned to his old place, and with the last ball dismissed B. W. Pigg, who had withstood the onslaught for something like half an hour. Six wickets had gone for 34, three runs only having been added since Whybro left the scene of action. G. A. Rose and Watts indulged in some hard hitting, the former sending the ball out of the ground on two occasions. Hallam displaced Day at the pavilion end, and the score, which was then 65, was carried to 76, when Watts (whose 16 included a 6) was caught off Hallam. A similar fate befell Coulson, who had contributed two to the total, and C. Pigg.

On joining G. A. Rose, was dismissed with the very first ball he received from Hallam. Broughton went on again in place of Riley at the Deacon's-lane end on the conclusion of Hallam's over. Another change of bowling then took place at the pavilion end—Day going on in place of Hallam—and it had the effect of finishing the match. G. A. Rose, who was dismissed with Day's first ball, had made the highest score of the innings with 38, which included two sixes. Allen, the wicket-keeper, had once missed a skier from Rose, but the chance was a hard one owing to the glare of the sun. The Cambs. second innings occupied only one hour and a quarter, the total score reaching 95, which left Lincolnshire the winners by 196 runs. Scores and bowling analysis:—

For the losers, B W Pigg took 12 wickets in the match for 163 runs, including 8 for 56 in the Lincolnshire first innings. Rose top-scored with 38 which included 2 sixes and 5 fours.
