DORSET V. CORNWALL.
VICTORY FOR THE HOME COUNTY.

The tide turned for Dorset County and the first win this season may be recorded. This was against Cornwall, whom they defeated by four wickets in Poole Park, thus furnishing somewhat of a reply to the match at Camborne, when the Cornishmen were victorious by nine wickets.

Cornwall batted first (on Friday) and, with the exception of Vibart (84) there was no fall scoring. H. B. Cummins disposed of four wickets for 58 and W. Harrison of four for 71, and Cornwall's total for the innings was 171.

Dorset opened exceedingly well, R. H. D. Bolton, ably seconded by T. Fowler, putting on runs at an extraordinary rate. C. J. B. Webb (third man) had the misfortune to split his finger and retired. The Dorset side slackened off then, but the advent of C. P. Goodden (capt.) improved matters considerably. His partner, C. H. L. Kindersley, who was batting in excellent style, got run out in a most unfortunate manner, a hard straight drive from Goodden hitting the bowler on the foot and the ball bounded into the wicket. A useful overnight score by the brothers Harrison was added to in the morning, and Dorset completed their innings with a very respectable total.

In their second innings Cornwall made a very surprising start. Owing to dropped catches they put on runs with considerable ease, and the batting of Tresawna and R. Maunsell rather demoralised the Dorset bowlers. J. C. N. Bickford Smith was another hard nut to crack, but after he had been disposed of a very useful bit of bowling by A. M. Harrison polished off the innings.

By shortening the luncheon time it had been agreed to draw stumps at 5.50 to enable the Cornishmen to catch a train, and by the time Dorset got under weigh they had 85 minutes in which to obtain 100 runs to win. It was actually managed in five minutes over the hour, G. M. Gordon and A. M. Harrison making a very useful stand; otherwise wickets were falling at an alarming rate.

DORSET v. CORNWALL.

WESTCOUNTRYMEN BEHIND ON FIRST INNINGS

The return match in the Minor Counties Championship between Dorset and Cornwall opened at Poole yesterday morning on an excellent wicket. There were many changes from the teams which met at Camborne, when Dorset won by nine wickets, if anything the home county, with six fresh players, being strangers. Cornwall won the toss, but started badly. The first wicket went with nothing scored, the third at 19, and the fourth at 62. Vibart made a fine stand, his 44 including six 4s. At 124 the fifth wicket fell, which the seventh, eighth, and ninth went for 118, and the visitors were all out by three o'clock. Dorset opened well, the score being 117 before the first wicket went down, Bolton and Fowler giving a very good exhibition. Wickets then went quicker, the sixth falling at 177, but play improved, and the score was standing at 228 before the seventh man was dismissed. Webb injured a finger by striking the ground, and retired, scores—

In spite of the strike we had no difficulty in getting from Reading to Bournemouth. In fact, I may say here that the G.W.R., L. and S.W.R., and S.E. and C.R. all treated us with the utmost courtesy and consideration. On arriving at Poole Park on the Friday we found that Trevarthen, who, by the way, had not missed a county match in 15 years, was so poorly that Dr. Tresawna sent him to bed. This was a great disappointment to us, as the Helston professional is not far from being the best all-round man in the team. I am very glad to say that he recovered sufficiently to be able to travel home with us on the Saturday. The twelfth man filled the big vacancy and did what he could, but he is a long way from a Trevarthen. The wicket was perfect, the best our men have seen for the year. I wish we could get some like it in Cornwall. Unfortunately, I am not able to give such a detailed account of this match as I have of the others. We won the toss again and started with W. N. Bickford-Smith and Whitworth, Harrison fast right, and Cummins, fast medium right, had charge of the attack. Whitworth was caught by second slip off Harrison's third ball "W. N." and the doctor added 17, when the former fell to Harrison's third slip off one he knows he never ought to have touched. Two runs later Cummins got a break-back past the doctor, and three of our men were out for 17. H. Tresawna and Vibart considerably improved matters, the professional making some of his characteristic drives. Woodley, slow medium right, at 45 bowled for Harrison, who displaced Cummins at 53. At 62 Tresawna was caught at the wicket off Woolley (62-4-16). Romer and Vibart had just doubled the score by some attractive cricket when the former ran himself out in attempting a fifth run off a hard square cut. Meantime Vibart had got his 50, and looked like getting a lot more. Romer had made 24. J. C. Bickford-Smith just reached double figures before Harrison bowled him (150-9-10). After lunch Maunsell got a big six off Harrison, and Vibart two or three pretty off shots, which brought him to 84, just half the total, when Cummins bowled him (163-7-34). Maunsell was caught at the wicket at the same total, and the rest of the team did not distinguish themselves; Whiting certainly had no chance, and the innings closed for 171—a poor show on such a good wicket. Fowler and Bolton were the first pair for Dorset, and they put on 117 for the first wicket in very quick time, in spite of some good fielding, especially at cover. Most of our opponents treated our attack with little courtesy, and in the end put up a total of 378. We did much better in our second knock. The captain took Whitworth in with him. The latter saved the pair, but was lbw to Harrison when he had made 10, chiefly by good cuts (23.1-10). Maunsell fulfilled his mission well, and brought off some mighty hits, one for 6 over the sight screen at the pavilion end measuring 123 yards. He had topped the half century by 3 when he was bowled in trying to place one to leg. There were only 5 singles in his score (98-2-53). The skipper and his brother took the total to 145 by some clever cricket, when the doctor let go at Harrison and was bowled. Vibart very speedily got a couple of dozen—no. 8 this time—when he was given out stumped (130-4-24). "W. N." was run out without scoring (190-5-0). Romer succumbed to Harrison's leg breaks when he had got 5 only. J. C. Bickford-Smith now joined Tresawna, and the pair quickly added 60 by sound all-round cricket before the latter was lbw to the fast bowler. His 78 was obtained in quite his best style. Hawken's partnership with Smith yielded another well-got 50, of which Hawken's share was 13. At 307 the Helston skipper misjudged one from the slow bowler, A. Harrison, and was lbw. He never gave a chance, or anything like one, in his 77. It was the best innings I have ever seen him play. The Dorset men had to hustle for the 100 runs they wanted to win, and they lost six wickets before they succeeded. Whiting got a good one past Fowler in his second over, and in his next had Bolton well taken by Maunsell at mid-off (9-2-4). Gordon and A. Harrison reached 45. Arundell stayed with Gordon, who had got back to his real form, till 67, when Romer brought off a well judged catch close on the boundary. Cummins left, bowled by "W. N." at 74, and Gooden at 85, bowled by Whiting. However, W. Harrison and Gordon hit off the rest, and Dorset won by 4 wickets. The loss of Trevarthen possibly lost us this match; at any rate he would have made a lot of difference, and there wasn't very much to make up. In conclusion, our batting and fielding were good; our bowling was not. I give the minor counties table, south and west division, just to shew that we are not the winners of the wooden spoon. In conclusion I should like to thank our excellent hon. secretary for the splendid arrangements he made for our comfort on the tour.
