Bedfordshire Taste Defeat.

The visit of the Bedfordians to Norwich was by no means crowned with success, for there they encountered their first defeat of there they encountered their first defeat of the season, and that by no narrow margin. Norfolk did very well last week—the Nor-wich Cricket Week—for they gained 13 points out of a possible 15. They have this season had a lot of what is commonly known in sporting circles as "hard luck," for when they played at Bedford they struck one as being a very good all-round eleven. They gave us further proof of this last week end, when they upset Bedford-shire's record by beating them by 9 wickets.
