Had Bedfordshire won their last match at Felinstowe, on Wednesday, and Durham lost to Lines. which they didn't; they would have gone second to Staffordshire, and would have had the option of challenging that county to play off for the Divisional Championship. A good start was made, and although Penfold did not stay long, Wilson and Bennett sent up the century without further loss. Following this, somewhat of a collapse took place, but a useful partnership between Hill-Wood and Knight improved matters, and the innings realised 192. Bedfordshire did not do very well on going in to bat, for Wharmby and Holdstock were got rid of very cheaply. Bocquet, however, played splendid cricket, and Orr and Apthorp were both prominent. Bedfordshire's total stood at 104 for five wickets when bad light caused an adjournment.

Bocquet and Morcom resumed the Bedfordshire innings on Wednesday morning, before a good attendance of spectators, but the first-named only added three to his overnight total before he was caught and bowled by Penfold. Leventhorpe assisted Morcom to increase the visitors' score, but the last three men did not give much trouble, the whole side being out for 153. Thus the visiting county was 39 to the bad on the first innings. Suffolk performed but moderately in their second attemnt. Wharmby doing some fine bowling Bocquet and Morcom resumed the Bedfordfolk performed but moderately in their second attempt, Wharmby doing some fine bowling and taking five wickets for 49. A splendid last-wicket partnership, however, between P. P. Cornell and Trudgett improved their total, which only reached 139, the first-named being undefeated with 24 to his credit. have never seen Dean bowl, but I hear that he is able to maintain an accurate length for hours together, and is always difficult to score off, and it seems to me that he would be an excellent choice for the long-drawn-out games upon Australian wickets. Incidentally he has taken more wickets than any other bowler this season.

W. C. Smith has always been under-rated as a bowler. He should have played against the Australians in 1909, and he bowled very well against them in 1905 for his county. The theory that he can bowl only upon wet wickets has been completely exploded this summer, for he has taken the second largest number of wickets at a very reasonable cost. Your readers will remember that Mr. Warner's first team to Australia played their second and fifth Test matches on first team to Australia played their second and fifth Test matches on wickets ruined by rain. There is no reason why at least one of the Test matches this winter should not be thus contested, and on such a wicket Smith (with Woolley at the other end) would have been invaluable.

Furthermore, as the team consists of fifteen men, Smith need not have been played when the wicket did not suit his bowling.

One recognises, of course, that the Selection Committe have had a very difficult task before them, and have done their best, and one does not wish to blame them.

Perhaps one of your readers would be able to explain through your columns why these two men have not received invitations.
