MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP.

WILTS v. DORSET.—Fine weather favoured Wiltshire's Minor Counties Championship fixture with Dorsetshire, which was played on the South Wilts Cricket Ground, Beaminster, on Friday and Saturday. Winning the toss, Dorset batted first, their innings being opened by the Rev. W. W. Jephson and Knight. Both batsmen made light of the bowling of Willis and Newman, and the half-century was reached within three-quarters of an hour. The partnership was broken soon after by Squarey, who clean bowled Knight after he had compiled 51. Busk being dismissed for four, J. N. Carter joined Jephson, and together they succeeded in scoring 115 runs. Jephson's consistently good batting was a feature of the first innings his 110 being the highest individual score of the match. He was eventually caught by Newman, and two overs later Carter was similarly dismissed by Lovell-Hewitt off Squarey. E. F. Fookes, who made 46, and M. B. Elderton, who was caught after making 31, both made fine stands for Dorset. Wiltshire commenced their innings on the first day, but play was suspended after Fuller, Butler, and Bankier had been dismissed for 7, 40, and 10 respectively. The wicket was in good condition on Saturday morning, when Wiltshire's innings was continued. Newman and Awdry treated Adams' and Walby's deliveries with extreme caution, with the result that runs came very slowly. Five maiden overs were bowled in the first half-hour. The Dorset fielders were very smart, and likely leg-drives seldom got away. Dorset tried nearly all their available bowlers without success during the first hour and a-half, and a leg-byes put Wiltshire 200 up. Busk then took his turn with the ball, and sent down some dangerous low deliveries, but Awdry and Newman managed to put on 100 runs within an hour and forty minutes. After lunch a fine stand was made by Nash and Lovell-Hewitt, and Wiltshire were finally saved from a first innings' defeat by a three by Lovell-Hewitt off Walby. The home eleven were all out for 877. When Dorset started their second innings it seemed improbable that sufficient time remained for Wiltshire to win on both innings, but much to the surprise of both teams Dorset were dismissed for 91 in just under three hours. Jephson, who made such an excellent stand on the previous day, succumbed to Newman for 14, and Busk, who scored 15, had his wickets lowered by the same bowler. Carter and Squarey went in after tea and batted steadily, but they could do little with Newman's deliveries. Squarey was first dismissed by Newman, whose analysis at this stage was : 13½ overs, 8 maidens, 10 runs, 4 wickets. Fookes, who joined Carter, was clean bowled by a low delivery from Willis after making two, and Doulton took his place with the score standing at 66. Within a short time both Doulton and Carter were out. The batting then lost much of its sting, and Newman bowled 13 consecutive maidens. Having gained a lead of 63 on the first innings, Wiltshire now wanted 29 to win, and this they scored in about half-an-hour with the loss of one wicket only. Newman's was undoubtedly the best all-round performance of the match, and it was in no small way due to his tricky bowling that Dorset's second innings produced so few runs. Scores :—

WILTSHIRE v. KENT 2nd XI.

Wiltshire beat Kent 2nd XI, at Swindon by an innings and 107 runs. Incidentally, this is the first victory achieved by the county eleven on the Swindon ground since 1921. E. H. F. Fuller made his first three-figure innings for the county, being bowled by Beslee at 111, while Newman made the high score of 176 before being caught by Beslee from one of Hever's. Hever hit 21 4's. The home side finished their first innings with the total of 388, and very little more play was possible on the first day. On Saturday, however, Newman and Willis bowled to such good effect that Kent were all out for 78 at 12.30. Of course Kent, being 282 runs behind, had to follow on, and again Newman and Willis accounted for all the wickets except one, which fell to Sellick with the first ball bowled. Kent certainly did better in their second innings, but the county were in a strong position and did not look like getting defeated throughout the match. Several times, however, it looked very much as if the match would be left drawn, which would have given Wiltshire three points on the first innings lead. But after coming in three times on account of the rain, Kent were eventually dismissed at 5.30 for 185. In the two innings Newman took 10 wickets for 73 runs, and Willis 9 for 120.
