The outstanding feature of this match, played at Bradford-on-Avon on Saturday, was the brilliant form shown by A. Pearce, both with the bat and ball. Going in third wicket down, when the telegraph read 4-3-0, he helped to raise the score to 230 before being last man out to what in any case would have been the last ball of the innings. During his stay he sent the ball to the boundary 26 times in a magnificent innings of 141, marred only by an easy chance when his score was 66. He found an agreeable partner in F. Staples, whose 89 included eight ring hits. These two added 97 for the ninth wicket in 28 minutes. Left with only 90 minutes to get 240 runs, Spencer-Moulton's only policy was to play out "time." WILTSHIRE v. SURREY 2ND XI.

Surrey 2nd XI, who were entertained on Monday and Tuesday, last year secured a first innings win, and they scored a similar advantage this year. They were strongly represented, their team including no fewer than eight professionals. Surrey won the toss and elected to bat first. Pearce, a member of the South Wilts Club, took Cook's wicket when only one run had been scored, and when four runs had been secured Baldwin was caught. Pearce in his fifth over cleverly bowled Daily, who took nearly half-an-hour to make eight, and Cole fell before the same bowler with the score of 25. Runs were not easily obtained when Squires partnered Wilson, though the visiting team stood up better to the Wiltshire bowling. Between them Squires and Wilson made 42, when the latter was bowled by Smith. The score at the luncheon interval, when Squires and Mobey were together, was 96 for five wickets. For Wiltshire, Butler and Fuller started at the wickets, and were dismissed before the score had reached 14. Matters improved with Waters and Lovell-Hewitt batting, 31 runs being added before Lock bowled Waters. The score was 53 for four wickets when Bankier fell to A. Geary, and after adding seven more runs Lovell-Hewitt was dismissed by the same bowler. In spite of several changes in bowlers, Nash and Newman added 57 runs, and were unbeaten when the stumps were drawn on Monday evening. On Tuesday morning, however, when these two batsmen continued, Newman was bowled by Lock without adding to the score. R. W. Awdry, who then joined Nash, scored only four runs, being easily caught behind the wicket by Cole. Nash met a similar fate, and the innings soon closed. Before lunch Surrey had an hour's batting in their second innings. They lost three wickets for 44 runs, but by the interval Baldwin and Cole had increased the score to 71. Baldwin and Squires were the outstanding batsmen of the afternoon, the former registering 52 and the latter 68. At the tea interval the visitors, having scored 261 for the loss of six wickets, declared. Drizzling rain prevented Wiltshire from starting their second innings for an hour, and then Butler and Fuller made 15 runs. They were still batting when further rain forced the teams to abandon play. WILTSHIRE v. DORSET.

The concluding match of the week took place on Wednesday and yesterday, when in the Minor Counties Championship Wiltshire beat Dorset by an innings and 21 runs. Wiltshire disposed of the visiting batsmen for a total of 201 on Wednesday, and in starting their first and only innings made 188 for four wickets before the day's play closed. The Wiltshire innings was opened by Butler and Fuller. Fuller, however, was out lbw to Harrison before run had been scored. Then Waters was clean bowled by Harrison before the scoring had started. Butler had made four runs when he was dismissed by Jowett. A change took place when Lovell-Hewitt and Bankier were partners at the wickets. The Dorset bowlers found it no easy task to separate them. Lovell-Hewitt scored freely, and after making 81, which included nine fours, he was caught by White. Lovell-Hewitt and Bankier brought the score from 8 to 157. Nash joined Bankier, who still batted effectively, and when stumpers were drawn in the evening the pair were undefeated. Both batsmen continued yesterday morning to score rapidly. The score was at 221 when Bankier was caught at the wicket off Harrison, his 83 runs including seven boundaries. Wickets now fell more easily, but Nash stayed on long enough to make 135, this score including 20 fours. Wiltshire's innings closed at lunch time for 390. Batting again, Dorset started 189 runs behind. Four wickets fell for 76, and it seemed as though Wilts would have an easy victory. After two hours' batting the score reached 100. When Phillips was caught out after tea, five wickets were down for 119. White, who then joined his captain, Elderton, took 40 minutes to collect 11, when he was bowled by Butler. When Elderton, after making 54, was brilliantly caught in the slips by Butler, Wiltshire's chance of victory improved. Dorset then collapsed, Jowett being dismissed after making one and Harrison being cleaned bowled by Butler after scoring five. The game concluded with Sewell being lbw.

CRICKET WEEK.

ATTRACTIVE FIXTURE AT BEMERTON.

THREE GOOD MATCHES.

Despite the bad weather which invaded Salisbury during the Cricket Week last year, the Wilts County Cricket Club again decided to make the South Wilts Ground at Bemerton the venue of a similar event this year. Three attractive matches were arranged and the organisers must have been more than satisfied with the large attendances of spectators. Everything was done to ensure that visitors to the ground could see the games in comfort and even on August Bank Holiday when 1,600 people were present there was plenty of room for all. The wicket all through played magnificently and it was most favourably commented on. Rain slightly interfered with the play but a full week's cricket was possible.

WILTS C. AND Q. v. ETON RAMBLERS.

The week commenced on Friday when the Wilts Club and Ground were opposed to Eton Ramblers, that fine touring club. Last year the game ended in a draw but this year the match was fought out to an exciting finish, the Ramblers winning right on the stroke of time by five wickets. Rain delayed the start, but play was possible soon after mid-day, Wiltshire, captained by Col. R. W. Awdry, taking first knock. Against the bowling of Newman and Norris, the Moonshakers fared badly and wickets fell cheaply. The drying wicket made run getting difficult and in attempting to get the bowlers away, simple chances in the way of catches were given and accepted. Nine wickets were down for 96 but a fine stand was made for the last wicket by Capt. E. G. Bartlett and C. E. Awdry. These two went for the bowling and, despite changes, runs continued to mount up. With the score at 156, the partnership, which had produced 60 valuable runs, was broken up, Hubble, the well known Kent wicket-keeper taking Bartlett at the wicket, Awdry carrying his bat for 41. None of the Wiltshire side were clean bowled, all falling to catchers.

Eton opened with Hubble and Capt. Misa, who were well set, but after tea, Fielden, a Salisbury youth, who plays for South Wilts, got Hubble caught off his third ball, the first wicket falling at 66. Fielden continued to bowl well and five wickets were down for 83 when C. G. Benson and H. P. Taunton, another well known local cricketer, became associated. The rot was stopped and at close of play the former was not out for 65 and the latter 38. On Saturday they continued to bat, but Taunton was caught before scoring and Benson was out when he had added one to his overnight score, the whole side being dismissed for 252. Wilts batting a second time put together 204, thus leaving Eton to get 109 in 65 minutes. Hubble and Hoare saw 79 on the board before they were separated but wickets fell fairly frequently, and time was growing short. With Norris and Taunton together the Wilts' total had still not been passed and the last over was being bowled. Norris, however, off the fourth ball hit the winning run amidst cheers and great excitement. Amongst those watching the game were the Bishop, the Dean (Bishop Randolph) and Archdeacon Carpenter. WILTSHIRE v. DORSET.

The last match of the "week" and the second Minor Counties Championship game began on Wednesday when Wilts were opposed to Dorset who were out to avenge the defeat they sustained last year. The visitors batted first and their cricket on the whole was slow. The earlier batsmen were soon disposed of but R. D. Busk got hold of the bowling successfully and he had scored one over the half century when he fell a victim to Smith. Freeman and White played cautiously and although the latter was eventually clean bowled by Newman the former defied all the efforts of the Wilts bowlers. Pearce eventually took the ball and with his first delivery put down his wicket, the outgoing batsman having secured 45. The tail failed to wag, Wally alone playing anything like confidently, the visitors score eventually totalling 201.

Butler and Fuller opened Wiltshire's innings and there was a sensational start, for before a run was scored the latter was out leg before wicket to Harrison. Waters was bowled by the same bowler, two wickets being down for no runs. Butler was bowled by Jowett when he had scored four, and then Lovell-Hewitt and Bankier came into partnership and an amazing change took place. Both batsmen went for the bowling in fine style, and despite several bowling changes they defied all efforts to separate them. Lovell-Hewitt scored freely all round the wicket, and as fast as the field was moved to suppress his run getting methods he got his shots away to the unguarded parts of the ground. After collecting an attractive 81, which included nine fours, he was caught by White, he and Bankier having brought the score from eight up to 157. Bankier continued to bat steadily when Nash joined him and the pair were undefeated when stumps were drawn, Bankier being not out 74, and Nash not out 18. On play being resumed yesterday (Thursday) morning, the overnight batsmen went on to score freely but with the score at 221 Bankier was caught at the wicket off Harrison for a perfect 83 which included seven boundaries. Wickets now fell more easily but Nash got well on top of the bowling and hit freely, but when in the 80's he gave a chance which should have been accepted. He signalled this escape by going on to complete the first century compiled during the week. Although he was again let off soon afterwards he stayed to make 135 before he was caught and bowled by Harrison, his fine innings including 20 fours. Wiltshire continued to bat until lunch time when the innings closed for 390. Harrison bowled no fewer than 53.4 overs and secured five wickets. Dorset batting again needed 189 runs to save the innings defeat, and when four wickets were down for 75 Wiltshire looked like securing an easy victory. Elderton (who had gone in first) and Phillips by cautious batting carried the score along, the hundred being hoisted after almost two hours' batting. Phillips was out soon after tea and White joined his captain, five wickets being down for 119. The incoming batsman played the right game for the occasion and was batting 40 minutes for 11 when he was bowled by Butler. Dorset were fighting hard for runs, but Wiltshire's chance was improved when Elderton, who had been batting since the innings commenced, was brilliantly caught in the slips by Butler for a magnificent 54 acquired by patient batting. A collapse now set in, Jowett leaving after making one and A. Harrison being clean bowled by Butler with the score at 168. The end soon came the total reaching 168, so that Wiltshire secured a creditable victory by an innings and 21 runs. The return game takes place to-day (Friday) and to-morrow, at Sherborne. THE SEASON'S AVERAGES.

Trowbridge.

During the season just closed Trowbridge played 24 matches, won 5, lost 7, and drew 12, which most people will agree are remarkable figures if only from the fact that exactly half the matches were drawn. The number of matches in which a decision in Trowbridge's favour was reached is disappointing, but some exceedingly good performances were achieved, and several of the drawn games had strong indications of a Trowbridge victory. F. Vallis, the Monkton Combe cricket coach, is top of the batting averages, having played eight innings and scored two centuries, his average being 39.87. A. J. P. Ling, a young batsman who shows promise of great things, follows him close with 39.40 for six innings, while in comparison with these two W. Lovell Hewitt has played 17 innings, scored more runs than anyone else (472) and has an average of 29.50. W. H. Payne, who has proved a valuable opening batsman, is further down the list with an average of 21.52, but next to W. Lovell Hewitt he has scored the largest number of runs (409) in 10 innings. C. N. W. Blair has again proved himself to be the club's most reliable bowler, and is top of the bowling averages with 62 wickets for 820 runs in 30.1 overs—or about 50 more overs than anyone else. His wickets cost him 13.82 runs each. A. A. Batley and E. F. Hullcooper follow him close, but they each bowled more than 100 overs less.
