#### MR. H. C. HACKNEY.

We regret to record that on Saturday, at the University College Hospital, London, Mr. Harold Clifford Hac'tney, second son of Dr. and Mrs Hackney, of Hythe, passed away after a long and

painful illness.

Mr. Hackney, who was twenty-seven, was born at Hythe, and partly educated in the district. He was a very versatile sportsman, and had identified himself with local clubs and activities in this direction to an extent which will cause him to be greatly missed in many circles. Before he took up these duties, however, he had become well-known as a cricketer, having played for the Kent second eleven in 1924.
