

COLTS OPEN THEIR SEASON.

Day in the Field Against Council Side.

(By Our Own Representative.)
SOUTH KIRKBY, Monday.

The members of the Yorkshire Second Eleven have started their season's work with a day in the field, and the indications are that their opening match with the Yorkshire Council will end in the usual draw. There will have to be some very unusual play to-morrow to bring the game to a definite ending, for the wicket which the South Kirkby groundsmen has prepared especially for this game, has been a batsman's delight to-day, and the odds are all in favour of it causing the Council bowlers as much work to-morrow as it has created for the Colts to-day.

The larger wicket is being given a trial—but the pitch has been brought to such a state of perfection that it does not seem that the size of the wicket has mattered. At all events the earlier Council batsmen got runs when they wanted them. Harry Bedford, the Barnaley player, who has been a member of the Colts' side for two or three seasons, played in the Council ranks to-day, and had the distinction of making the top score of the innings. He started slowly, but later he used his bat as he did a season or two ago when he played several really fine innings for the Colts, and he was fifth out with 72—he hit seven 4's and one

5—out of 191 to his credit. Brighter innings were those of Phillips, the Otley batsman, and Davidson, who, like Bedford, has played with the Colts. Davidson got his 40 runs in something like three-quarters of an hour, while Phillips, with his 39, was the first to show that runs could be got comfortably on this wicket.

Verity, who is to play with Yorkshire against Sussex at Huddersfield on Wednesday, is a left arm slow to medium bowler from Rawdon who has improved a deal since he went into Lancashire League cricket. His first spell to-day revealed some exceedingly good work, but later he was hit freely. Hall, the York fast bowler, suffered before tea, but afterwards took five wickets for 20 runs.

The Colts' fielding has been good with the ground work of Greenwood, the Huddersfield amateur, outstanding. Buller, the Colts' wicket keeper, is to have a trial with the county along with Verity. He plays with Hunslet in the Leeds League, and his work this afternoon has been cool and competent. Scores:—

COLTS' MATCH ENDS IN DRAW.

Young Council Bowler's Success.

(By Our Own Representative.)
SOUTH KIRKBY, Tuesday.

The Yorkshire Second Eleven's opening fixture with the Council has ended in the customary draw, but the match, which, in view of the promise shown by youngsters on both sides will be reckoned to have thoroughly justified itself, got nearer a decisive ending than has been the case with those games in recent seasons. This afternoon the bowlers got the upper hand on a wicket which yesterday was altogether in favour of the batsmen, and in the last two and a quarter hours' play this evening no fewer than fourteen wickets fell.

The domination of the attack is shown by the fact that 23 wickets have been taken to-day, and 11 of them have been captured by Morton, of Castleford, whose bowling has overshadowed everything else in the match. Morton had Grimshaw caught by Maroney last night, he captured Broadhead's wicket with the third ball to-day, and after that, except for one spell, he was always the master. His bowling was chiefly responsible for the Colts' first innings total falling 88 short of that of the Council, and his work in the second innings almost gave the Council the victory.

In the first innings he claimed half-a-dozen wickets for 46 runs in 22 overs, and in the second innings he took the first six Colts' wickets for 21 runs in 11 overs. He bowled seven men, and the ball which beat Fisher was good enough to beat almost anyone. Morton, who is 20 years old, has only had one full season in club cricket. He has a very easy action, takes his right arm well over, and sends down a fair paced ball which is fast off the pitch. He can swing a new ball, and is a young man of whom a deal more may be heard.

The feature of the Colts' first innings was the work of Halstead, a young right-hand batsman from Todmorden, who went in at the fall of the second wicket and carried out his bat for 40. It was a good innings for a first game with the Second Eleven, and it was entirely due to him that his side saved the follow-on. He defended soundly and got his runs well.

The Council, in their second innings, lost seven wickets for 35. Fisher, the Barnaley left-arm bowler, took four wickets for 24, and Smalles, a newcomer from Harrogate, three wickets for 11, and then the Council captain declared, setting the Colts the task of scoring 123 in an hour and a quarter. With Morton bowling so effectively they never looked like getting the runs, indeed they had to fight to save the game. Grimshaw and Greenwood were the men who stopped the fall of wickets. Scores:—

LANCS. II. RETRIEVE A BAD START.

Centuries by Farrimond and Horridge.

After opening in such auspicious fashion as to capture two wickets without a run scored, and the third with the total only ten, the Yorkshire colts were kept in the bald for four hours by their Lancashire opponents at Old Trafford yesterday. Not only did the Lancashire colts make a complete recovery, but were in a position to declare their innings at the tea interval with the total 375 for 9 wickets.

For this satisfactory position, Horridge and Farrimond were entirely responsible. Coming together when seven wickets had fallen for 100 runs, this experienced pair took such toll of the Yorkshire bowling as to indulge in a partnership which produced 243 runs in a two hours 20 minutes. During their partnership, practically every other hit was a boundary. Farrimond having no fewer than 25 such strokes in his faultless 134, while Horridge reached the rails 16 times in his 126.

It was beautifully free cricket, Farrimond's century occupying him no longer than an hour and 40 minutes, while that of Horridge just exceeded two hours. All else throughout the day was dwarfed into insignificance, but throughout all, Verity never lost his accuracy or length, and with three wickets for 63 runs was the most successful Yorkshire bowler.

Facing this total, Broadhead and Bedford gave Yorkshire a fair start by scoring 21 for the first wicket before Broadhead was lbw. Eight runs later Bedford was brilliantly run out, but an hour and 30 minutes batting produced 100 without further loss. Halstead reached 50 in 65 minutes, but Greenwood failed by one run to emulate the feat. The third wicket stand put on 111 in 80 minutes, and at the close Yorkshire were 225 behind with 7 wickets to fall. Scores:—

COLTS' MATCH ENDS IN A DRAW.

Yorkshire's Good Reply to Big Lancashire Score.

The minor counties match between Lancashire and Yorkshire ended in a tame draw at Old Trafford, last evening, with Lancashire taking three points for leading on the first innings by 36 runs. Each side completed an innings, and the 19 wickets produced 714 runs, an average of about 37 per wicket. Apart from one or two individuals on either side, the standard was not high, the bowling being mediocre, and the fielding loose for the most part.

Overnight rain delayed the resumption of the Yorkshire reply, in which three wickets had fallen for 150 runs, but the wicket remained slow and easy, and there never appeared to be much prospect of a definite finish. Halstead, 86, and Fisher, who carried out his bat for 74, were the Yorkshire batting successes. Each had eight fours, but the brightest display of the innings was provided by the captain, Major R. C. Chichester-Constable, who lifted Horridge for six, and hit up 35 in 40 minutes.

Hodgson, who takes the place of R. Tyldesley in the Lancashire team to meet Sussex today, was the only bowler to meet with real success, his six wickets costing 115 runs. Monday's partnership of 243 between Farrimond and Horridge is a record for the eighth wicket in any grade of Lancashire County cricket, and a minor counties' record in addition. Scores:—

Verity's Big Part in Defeat of Notts. II.

The Yorkshire II. v. Notts II. match at Middlesbrough had a remarkable ending yesterday, Notts being beaten in the extra half-hour by three wickets. This was a happening no one expected earlier in the day, for Yorkshire's remaining three wickets only go the side to within 71 of their opponents' first innings total of 212. When Notts II. went in a second time, however, they found Verity even more deadly than on the previous day. He had the batsmen guessing all the time, and the extent of his success is shown by the following figures: 19.5 overs, 11 maidens, 17 runs, 5 wickets.

Eleven wickets for 85 represents a good match return for the Middleton professional. His work yesterday definitely turned the game in Yorkshire's favour, although credit is due to the excellent fielding of the side and to Morton for an inspired after-lunch bowling spell, when, as on the previous day, he got all his wickets.

Ten for one was not a good start, but Bedford and Sellars faced the position coolly, and in two hours the pair brought victory within sight. Then, with the score turned 150, both men departed, being victims to Gunn, who had been brought into action rather late. Bedford only gave one chance, a skier to short leg. Sellars played sound cricket for his 49—a very satisfactory first match for the Keighley man.

Son of Former Captain Gets Ponsford Out.

The story of how a young Yorkshire boy, the son of a former Yorkshire captain, got Ponsford, the Australian cricketer, out, was told yesterday.

The previous day the Australian players visited Downside School, near Bath, where they indulged in practice. Members of the School eleven and some County players did the bowling, and while Ponsford was at the wicket the School wicket-keeper, Harold de Tenthay O'Kelly, caught him off the bowling of Hugh Radcliffe, the 19-year-old captain of the School.

He is a son of Mr. F. J. Radcliffe, who was captain of the Yorkshire XI. from 1909 to 1911. He lives at St. Trinian's Hall, Richmond, Yorkshire, and is the grandson of Sir Joseph Radcliffe, of Ridding Park, Follifoot, Harrogate. Hugh Radcliffe's three brothers are all keen cricketers, the eldest being captain of the Sandhurst XI. Hugh has been in the Downside XI. two years, and succeeded to the captaincy this year.

Mr. D. C. F. Burton, another ex-captain of Yorkshire, has been coaching at Downside, but young Radcliffe owes something to the enthusiasm and coaching of his mother. When he was a small boy of even she used to take him into Kensington Gardens and, contrary to regulations, practice with a hard ball.

WEAK BATTING BY THE COLTS.

Northumberland's Victory at Newcastle.

At Newcastle yesterday Northumberland beat Yorkshire II. by an innings and 143 runs, the game ending at 5.25. Yorkshire resumed in the morning, requiring 278 to avert the follow-on, but they only totalled 119 and had to go in again in arrears of 262. They were again dismissed for 119 curiously enough, and never recovered from a bad start made in both innings.

CRICKET BETWEEN THE SHOWERS.

Minor Counties Score Well at Old Trafford.

LANCASHIRE'S WEAK SIDE.

(From Our Special Correspondent.)

OLD TRAFFORD, Wednesday. Lancashire stepped aside from the path of County cricket to-day, when as was the case a year ago, they occupied one of their blank dates by a match with a team chosen by the Minor Counties. The value of such a fixture, however, is considerably reduced by the fact that certain of the sides are closed to the selectors by the current progress of games in which the Yorkshire, Nottingham, Cheshire, and Staffordshire sides are engaged, which withheld a number of players who might otherwise have appeared here. As it was, the eleven had to be made up largely of representatives of the southern counties, with one from Durham, and two from Lancashire itself, one of them, Horridge, a member of the ground staff at Old Trafford.

The County authorities, too, took the match fairly lightly, resting Ernest Tyldesley, Watson, and Macdonald, but Richard Tyldesley rejoined the team after his experience in the Test match at Headingley, and Hallows was again included, after being absent for three matches, along with Latchford, who is one of the County's young school of professionals, and a boy of whom John Tyldesley has a high opinion.

As was the case last summer, the play was greatly cut up by rain after a start at two o'clock, the cricket being largely made up of brief snatches between showers, which kept the wicket and the ball wet. In all, the active periods amounted to no more than two hours twenty minutes, and play was not calculated to entertain the small attendance very highly.

W. T. Cook, a left-handed batsman, who has played a number of times in previous seasons for Surrey, and is now captain of the second eleven, had a capital knock, in which he showed strong driving power, in addition to some facility on the leg side. Most of the others, however, made but a poor resistance to bowling that offered no serious problem, and in one spell before the second interruption Hopwood took three wickets for four runs, two with successive balls, at which point four wickets were down for 57.

GOOD PARTNERSHIP.

After the third suspension, however, Cook found a very capable partner in Dobson, the Durham left-hander, who showed a strong partiality for the pace bowling, and between them the two completely turned the game. Cook reached his fifty in ten minutes under two hours, and, although he lofted his drives a lot, and had narrow escapes, his stroke play was generally well timed.

The unfinished partnership, in which Dobson had a hand, lasted seventy minutes, and in the time 88 were scored by free cricket. Finally, this much-interrupted day's cricket ceased at twenty minutes to six, when the light became so bad that it was impossible to continue.

During the day it transpired that Booth, the all-round player, who has been on the Old Trafford ground staff for five years, but has only just begun to find a footing in the county side, had intimated his intention to sever his connection with Lancashire, and was about to sign a contract with East Lancashire at Blackburn, but I understand that the county authorities contemplate consideration of his case, which may result in his staying. At present the agreement with East Lancashire only requires his signature. Scores:—

LANCASHIRE BATSMEN SUBDUED.

Hallows Scores 5 Runs in 65 Minutes.

MINOR COUNTIES LEAD.

(From Our Special Correspondent.)

OLD TRAFFORD, Thursday. Lancashire have not lost a county match this season so far, but they fared so badly to-day in their game with the Minor Counties that defeat is by no means distant. If they are to avoid it they will have to play a different type of cricket from that which saw them finish up 23 in arrears on the first innings. During the completion of their opponents' batting, they did not appear to take their work any too seriously, even though Hopwood and Richard Tyldesley bowled throughout the hour and a quarter, that the innings stretched out to, for the latter experimented a great deal, and for the most part tossed up high pitched slow balls that gave away many runs, otherwise he would have come out with a better record than five wickets at an average cost of over 14, all of which he took this morning for 41.

Hopwood bowled in more orthodox fashion and had he not been badly used by his field, his figures of four for 43 would have been considerably more flattering. Three catches were missed, two of them very simple ones.

The overnight stand of Cook and Dobson, which had been the one bright spot in the Minor Counties' innings, did not run much further, but in all it raised 110 in 95 minutes, before the Durham man literally shattered his wicket in attempting to cut a slow ball. He had played good, if not instructive cricket, in helping Cook, who was in for two hours and 30 minutes. The latter's innings was rather patchy, but it was always entertaining, and most of his ten fours were hearty drives. He was missed twice in the same place, short leg, first when 16, and then at 76.

None of the others made any resistance worth the name, and the outstanding six wickets fell for 71 runs, but this was little worse than Lancashire's experience when they went in, Brindley and Smith bowling so well that in twenty-five minutes before the adjournment, only nine were scored, and in the further two hours between lunch and tea, six wickets went down for the total of 83.

The Lancashire batsmen, indeed, showed little liking for Smith's rising deliveries, the Wiltshire man varying his out swinger by straight balls that lifted quickly. Hopwood was hit several times on the body, and though he was the highest scorer during this period of the innings, he got a number of his runs off the edge.

BRILLIANT FIELD WORK.

The Minor Counties' bowlers were excellently supported, and not only were three splendid catches taken in the slips, that by Hartley being positively brilliant, but Inge, who is now graduating at Oxford, stumped Iddon first ball beautifully on the leg side.

Hallows actually spread two scoring strokes, a four and a single, over an hour and five minutes, and did not score at all for half an hour following the interval, while two hours' batting produced no more than 68. This kind of thing did not put Lancashire's cricket in a high light, and only stouter batting by Eckersley, Farrimond and Tyldesley saved the innings from something approaching collapse.

Farrimond again illustrated his value as a batsman, particularly when runs are wanted, and the last wicket put on 45 in half an hour, but it did not prevent the Minor Counties from entering upon their second innings with a lead which was extended during the twenty minutes that remained, to one of 37 without loss. EXCITING PLAY AT REDCAR.

Four Yorkshire Colts Out for Two Runs.

After a somewhat slow beginning, an exciting day's cricket developed in Yorkshire II.'s last match with Durham at Redcar yesterday. Durham reached 142 for five wickets, but were all out for 156, four wickets falling at the same total after a drying wind had begun to affect the pitch.

Ferens remained for two and a half hours to be fourth out at 114, but Moore and Dobson hit out more brightly.

Then came a remarkable change in the game, the fifth, sixth, seventh, and eighth wickets falling at 142, and the ninth at 143. Richardson juggled with the ball, making three attempts and was at one elbow on the ground before he caught Moon. In Fisher's second over from this, and again in the slips, Richardson caught Ward, very neatly this time. In the next over, which was his fourth successive maiden, Turner got Hardy caught by Major Chichester-Constable, and Jennings rounded off the spell by stumping Carr off Fisher, in the over which followed. One run later Jennings caught Howell off Fisher's bowling. The innings, however, did not completely fizzle out. Hutchinson and Ellis decided to die fighting, and Hutchinson's contribution was a lusty clout for six, off Turner. The innings closed at 4.30, after an exciting half hour.

Fisher took all his wickets during his second spell with the ball, and 29 of the 34 runs against him were hit before he had any success. Backhouse also had two spells, and was better in the first spell, when the wicket was easiest. He had one run hit in his first over, his next two were maidens, another run was hit off the first ball of his fourth over, and the next ball bowled Gibbons. He got his second wicket in a spell of 12 overs after lunch. Turner had only one turn with the ball, and was at once difficult to play.

In addition to the drying wind there was a little sunshine as the Colts went in to bat. The effect was soon apparent. In Ellis's second over, which was a maiden, like his first, he took Broadhead's wicket with the first ball, and that of Sellers with the last. Only one run had been scored, off Howell. In his third over Ellis bowled Bedford, with two runs on the board, and Howell took Turner's wicket at the same total.

Backhouse and Richardson looked like making a stand, but had only taken the score from two to 12 when Backhouse was Ellis's fourth victim. Durham were thoroughly on their toes, and this effective bowling was backed up by keen fielding. Richardson and Fisher tried hard to pull the game round, hitting anything at all loose, but Ellis was in great form, and, bowling unchanged, made full use of a wicket that was now definitely tricky. Yorkshire's Second Eleven made a splendid recovery in the Minor Counties' Championship match on the Recreation ground here to-day, and had the satisfaction of being the first side to cause Durham to drop points in this season's competition.

Durham, who had a percentage of 100—the result of five victories in five games—seemed certain to retain it when play was resumed this morning. In reply to their first innings total of 156 the Colts had only been able to score 42 for 9 wickets. The young Yorkshiremen's effort ended at 47 and they had to follow on.

The wicket, which turned so decisively in favour of the bowlers yesterday afternoon, played queerly again this morning, and the Colts' second innings opened so disastrously that there seemed every likelihood of their failing to equal their first innings score, and of the match being over before lunch. Broadhead was caught behind the wicket before he had scored, and, with only seven runs on the board—six of them had been got by Sellers—Bedford and Turner followed him back to the pavilion, also without scoring. Backhouse was out with the total 8, and it seemed that Ellis, who in the Colts' first innings took seven wickets for 19 runs, and A. Howell, who, on this ground a few years ago on a very similar sort of wicket caused the Colts a deal of trouble, would go right through the side.

Ellis had two wickets in his first two overs without a run being scored off him, and the attack had complete command of the position until Sellers began to settle down. He played a brave innings and was never afraid to hit out. With the Scarborough amateur, Richardson, he took the score to 26—an invaluable stand this as things turned out—and then with the wicket recovering in an astonishing fashion he found the right partner in the Barnsley left-hander, Fisher. They carried the score to 94, removed the possibility of an innings defeat, and set the Colts on the way to a most honourable draw.

GREAT PARTNERSHIP.

Sellers scored his 53 out of 94 in just under two hours, and then with the wicket playing as easily as it did at the start of the Durham first innings, yesterday, Verity and the Colts' captain, Major Chichester Constable, carried the score from 104 to 246 in merry style. This seventh wicket partnership was as bright an affair as the Colts have had this season.

Verity got to his half-century in 92 minutes—he welcomed it with a mighty pull for six, lifting the ball out of the ground—and the Major, who made his top score of the season, passed his 50 in under an hour and a half. The result of the rally was that Durham had to bat again, and when they started their second innings they needed 152 for victory, and had ninety minutes in which to obtain the runs. Adamson and Gibbon got 25 in the first quarter of an hour, but Fisher and Turner bowled well enough to check the scoring. Still, 90 runs were obtained in just over the hour. Durham were going for the runs, and when Gibbon fell a victim to Verity, Carr, a hitter, was sent in to see what he could do. Verity quickly accounted for him, however, and with the fall of his wicket stumps were drawn, and Durham had to be content with first innings points. Scores:—

REVIEW OF THE COLTS' SEASON.

Lack of Consistency in Batting.

NEWCOMERS' PROGRESS.

(By Our Special Correspondent.)

Those who regard the work of the Yorkshire Second Eleven purely from the standpoint of the results of their matches in the Minor Counties' Championship competition will find complete justification for a comment that the season has been far from what it might have been. One match only has been won, against four lost, and first innings points have been gained once and dropped twice. The other two matches—with Lancashire's Colts at Halifax and Northumberland at Rotherham—were washed out by rain.

The result of the season's campaign is that the Colts are said to be in as low a position in the Minor Counties' Championship as ever they have been; but this notwithstanding, there is reason for satisfaction in the fact that some of the young men who have been tried with the Colts have made distinct progress, and that others, newly introduced, have revealed the right sort of promise.

The winning of the Minor Counties' Championship never has been the aim of the Yorkshire Second Eleven. The side exists for the sole purpose of finding and developing youngsters for the first team, and the Minor Counties' Championship is consequently used merely as a sort of a school in which these young cricketers can be tested and trained. This is a point which must never be overlooked if a fair impression is to be gained when contemplating the work of the Second Eleven.

The weakness of the side this season has been in batting, and this has been as surprising as it has been disappointing, in view of the extraordinary promise which young men of the stamp of Broadhead, Bedford, Shackleton, and others showed last season and the season before. On occasions they have shown the form they are known to be capable of, but their lack of consistency has affected the success of the side. A comparison of the averages of the Colts' leading batsmen this season with those of recent years shows just how much the batting has fallen away—there has not been a century scored by a member of the side this season.

CAPTAIN'S SATISFACTION.

When I talked on the season's work with Major R. C. Chichester-Constable, the Colts' captain, he found chief satisfaction in the bowling, the fielding, which has been maintained at a high level, and the play of several of the newcomers. Among the most promising of these newcomers to the side has been A. B. Sellers, an amateur from the Keighley district; J. A. Richardson, who has scored many runs for Scarborough in Yorkshire Council cricket this season; Halstead, of Todmorden, a likely batsman; and Morton, a young bowler from the Castleford district, who did well enough in one or two trials to rouse hopes that he will progress in the right way.

Sellers, who, like F. E. Greenwood last season, has set a fine example in the field, played a sound innings for 53 against Durham in the closing match—his determined stand did much to save the match with the Colts—and in this game Richardson, a batsman with a good style, did his work well at the right time. This was a match, too, in which Verity distinguished himself with the bat and ball. It may be, of course, that the season will be remembered mainly as that in which Verity returned to the Colts' side to advance quickly. Verity's form with the first team has, one imagines, just about lifted him out of the ranks of the Colts.

Another slow left arm bowler who might, the Major thinks, be given an extended trial next season is Backhouse, who is on the ground staff at Lord's. Of Fisher, the Barnsley all-rounder, Major Chichester-Constable has a high opinion, and Cyril Turner, the young Sheffield United professional who has been with the Colts for five or six seasons now, has been as reliable and consistent as ever. Hall, the Colts' fast bowler of last season, has done quite well again, and has proved his ability with the first team as an emergency man.

Altogether 22 young men have been tried with the side, and, while some of them have not fulfilled the high hopes their work last season aroused, there can be no doubt that there are cricketers of more than ordinary promise among them. Of the keenness and enthusiasm of the young men who have been tried, the Colts' captain speaks highly, and it is good to know that their behaviour on and off the field has been just what is expected of members of Yorkshire's Second Eleven.
