MINOR COUNTIES MATCH AT FOLKESTONE.

KENT II. v. SURREY II.

Rain marred the Minor Counties match between Kent II. and Surrey II. which opened on the cricket ground at Folkestone on Monday and only one day's play was possible. This was on the first day when Kent gained a first innings lead of 58 after being sent into bat by Surrey, who had won the toss.

The wicket was a little soft on Monday morning and when Kent had lost three wickets for 35 runs it looked as if the Surrey skipper's action in putting Kent in might be justified. Partnerships of 29 and 55 followed however, but with the next three wickets only adding nine, the sixth and the seventh both falling at 123, hopes were revived. It was then, however, that another stand was made and which completely altered the complexion of things. Actually, 71 was put on before the partnership was broken. The innings came to an end shortly afterwards, the total being 200.

For this score Kent had to thank Hubble, T. A. Crawford and T. F. Mitchell in particular. Hubble knocked up 88, his strokes including five fours, Crawford failed to reach the half century by three, his best hits being four fours, and T. F. Mitchell had the honour of being top scorer of the game with 74. In the latter's innings were seven fours, one three, and ten twos.

Surrey replied to the Kent total with a score of 142, to which C. E. Nicol, with 63, was the highest contributor. Six of the other batsmen reached double figures and Geary, who was second top scorer, carried out his bat with 26. The innings came to an end about ten minutes past six and Kent had ten minutes' batting before stumps were drawn for the day, during which time they scored eight without loss.

During Monday night heavy rain fell and made play impossible on the following day. The umpires deferred making a decision to abandon the match until 4.30 in the afternoon, hoping that it might be possible for a couple of hours' play to take place. After inspecting the wicket with the two captains, they then decided that the game would have to be given up. Kent II. therefore took the major points for a first innings lead.

The bowling honours of the match went to Lock (Surrey II.) and Blunden (Kent II.). The former captured six wickets for 77 runs and Blunden took five for 80. As far as the fielding was concerned, W. H. Levett did well for Kent II., having two catches and one stumping to his credit and for Surrey II., Sunshine brought off three catches.

The attendance on the opening day numbered about 200.

KENT II V. SURREY II.

Kent 2nd XI were despoiled of a possible victory in their two-days match with Surrey 2nd XI on Monday and Tuesday, the wicket being unplayable on the second day owing to rain.

On the first day the weather conditions were ideal, and Kent were sent in first, by Cook, on a slightly soft pitch, which broke up slowly during the day.

There was some very good play on either side. In making a valuable 74 for Kent Mitchell hit seven boundaries and employed a good variety of strokes without giving a chance. For Surrey, Lock took 6 Kentish wickets for 77 runs, an excellent performance.

In the Surrey innings Nicol was the only player to stand up to the Kent attack for any time. He scored 33, hitting four 4's. Geary hit the only six of the match i. his total of 26. Blunden, of Kent, a very fast right-handed bowler, took 5 wickets for 80, and he was also excellent in the field, his catching and picking up being remarkably sure. He is worth consideration for the Kent County team.

KENT'S POOR START.

Kent started none too well in their first innings. Fairservice stepped back to a ball from Lock when he had scored nine and retired with his off stump shattered. Hawes collected a single and then fell a victim to the same bowler. Pierce also did not stay long, for he snicked a low ball from Lock into Sunshine's hands. The score then stood at 45-1.

A change came over the game, however, when Crawford joined Hubble. These two punished Geary so much at one time Hubble hit four 4's in succession, that Gould, a slow left-handed bowler, came on at the pavilion end. Crawford gave a chance to first slip when he had made 6, but the fielder failed to hold the ball securely and Crawford went on to hit a number of well-timed boundaries. Soon after Crawford came in, Hubble, who had never been comfortable with Gould, had his wicket shattered by a deceptive full-pitched ball.

Both Mitchell and Crawford played very carefully after this reverse, and the hundred was passed just before lunch, the score at lunch-time being 109-4, with Mitchell and Crawford still undefeated.

Only another 11 was added to the score after lunch, when Crawford had the misfortune to step into a ball from Lock and was given out lbw, with the total at 120-5. His 47 included four 4's.

Mitchell, however, was well set now and Cooke had put Squires on in place of Gould in the hope of getting rid of this stubborn player. Mitchell found little support in the Kent skipper, Simpson, who, after hitting a four and a single, placed a ball from Geary, who had gone on again in place of Lock, into Sunshine's hands. Levett left with no addition to the score, was caught off Geary by the same fielder.

With the score at 129-7 it seemed that Kent would be all out for less than 150, because Geary was finding a treacherous length and the wicket was inclined to break up. Lewis, however, coming in next, provided Mitchell with a steady partner and he began to hit out. Within the next 50 minutes the score rocketed from 128 for 5 to 198 for 5-70 in 50 minutes.

At 199, and in attempting to record the two hundredth run, Lewis misjudged a ball from Lock and placed it into the hands of Wilson.

Blunden failed to register a run, being cleanly bowled by Lock, and, after seeing the 200 up, Mitchell skied a ball from Geary and was caught by the bowler. Thus the Kent first innings ended for a much higher total than was expected, thanks to Mitchell who stepped into the breach when a procession seemed likely, and to Lewis, who backed him up, although he himself only scored 19.

Surrey opened their innings disastrously. W. T. Cook, Squire, and Wilson were out before the score board had registered 20. Whitfield failed to add to the score and Mobery and Fishlock defied the Kent attack for a while, until, when he had scored 15, Mobery snicked a ball from Blunden into Levett's hands, behind the wicket. At tea Surrey had five men out for 44 runs.

UNEXPECTED RESISTANCE.

J. A. Sunshine was lbw when he had scored 14, but he stayed with Fishlock until the latter was bowled by Peach, with a 4. Gould, Geary, and Lock, in combination with Nicol, then put up an unexpected resistance, making 14, 26 not out and 13 respectively. At one time Geary and Nicol put on 40 in twenty minutes, Geary hitting a 6 and two 4's in succession. Nicol was out, caught and bowled Blunden, when he was 33, and Lock was stumped by Levett 20 runs later, the Surrey innings closing for 142.

Fairservice and Levett played out the remaining 10 minutes for Kent, scoring 8 without being parted.

Kent thus take five points for a first innings win, when it seemed highly probable that they would subdue Surrey by a comfortable margin. Scores:-
