Not one of their batsmen was comfortable against the Yorks. attack, and although Gunn stayed a long time he was only able to compile 30.

Gunn, however, had a particularly fine spell with the ball. Going on when the Yorks. score was about 50, he bowled so well that he had six wickets for 31 runs to his credit, but Dennis then hit out and Gunn's final analysis was 61 for 61.

Yorks. on their second venture lost King with Bland's second ball, and thereafter batted very cautiously. Halstead was stumped with the last ball.

408 RUNS SCORED IN ONE DAY.

Famous Cricketers on Sir Julien Cahn's Ground.

BEDFORDSHIRE, 193 all out. Sir JULIEN CAHN'S XI., 215 for four.

Although the outstanding incident in the two-day match between Sir Julien Cahn's team of talents and Bedfordshire was Stuart Rhodes' first century of the season, it was the Test atmosphere about the game which lured me to the well-appointed ground on Loughborough-road.

Gathered there were Dennis Morkel, the South African all-rounder, who, during their last tour made a century and reached 1,000 runs for the season against Notts. at Trent Bridge, R. W. V. Robins, the Middlesex and England bowler, and "Tich" Richmond, of the older Notts. and England school.

John Gunn as umpire completes an assembly of international fame. In the midst of all these famous cricketers the most modern representative of the game arrived in the person of Muriel Lowe, Nottingham's girl googly bowler.

Dennis Morkel, who is hoping to tour Australia in the coming winter, was the main object of my visit.

TRIP TO AUSTRALIA?

He was cleaned bowled by H. C. Salmonson for three and I wondered whether his cricket had suffered in consequence of a broken wrist sustained while playing rugby for Bedford, where he is studying engineering. He afterwards confessed that he had not yet recovered that complete suppleness of wrist essential to the successful batsman but had consulted a bone specialist and was hoping that he would be perfectly fit for Australia.

The ball which shattered his off stump in the second over, though it must be small consolation to him, was of the type which would have beaten almost anybody.

RUNS—OR OUT.

Composed entirely of amateurs—young amateurs nearly all in the early twenties—Bedfordshire were all out in 2 hours 20 minutes for 193. In accordance with the tradition of these two-day matches they either got runs or got out. In such pleasant surroundings it was the type of cricket which the public enjoy, but the attendance was disappointing. I am afraid Nottingham does not take full advantage of the facilities offered by Sir Julien Cahn.

R. W. V. Robins could only take four wickets for 45, but following the strain of county cricket the previous day his bowling was not so accurate as usual.

Richmond accomplished the best performance when he took the last three Bedfordshire wickets for only eight runs.

There is still craft and cunning in Richmond's bowling, and I think T. B. Reddick, who, I am told, "spins the ball like a top," possesses a perfect action for such bowling, might find Richmond a useful instructor. Reddick only bowled a couple of overs or so, but his length in that short time was nearly always faulty. But he has the style and should make a good pupil.

CENTURY BY RHODES.

Among the Bedfordshire batsmen E. F. C. Smith, a left-hander, who made an attractive 40 out of 109 in 75 minutes, and C. F. Rawlins, their captain, with 48 out of 68 in an hour, contributed the brightest moments, Rawlins coming to the rescue when half the side were out for 110 before lunch.

S. D. Rhodes' first century of the season confirmed my belief that he will one day find a permanent place in the County team.

After a somewhat tedious beginning, he punished the Bedfordshire bowling very severely in a stay of 2½ hours, and in scoring 110 out of 171 hit no fewer than 11 fours and two sixes, lifting the ball out of the ground into the allotments which fringe the fine leg boundary.

He opened the innings with Sir Julien Cahn, and his third wicket partnership with F. C. W. Newman, by adding 139 in 90 minutes, put the Nottingham team in a commanding position, Bedford's score being passed for the additional loss of Robins' wicket.

UNFETTERED AND FREE.

In an hour and a half after tea, when they had lost two wickets for 48, Sir Julien Cahn's batsmen, fulfilling the ethics of brighter cricket, hit no fewer than 167 runs, F. C. W. Newman still a fine forcing batsman, being still undefeated at the close with 47.

Here was cricket unfettered by points and free of cost. Eighty runs an hour was a testimonial to the game. But the wicket was dead, and Bedfordshire must have sighed for a Richmond.

DREARY LANCASHIRE BATTING.

It was not surprising that there was only a mere handful of spectators on the Queen Elizabeth Grammar School ground on Wednesday, when these teams met. Firstly, because the match had not been advertised and consequently few people knew anything about it; and secondly, because the weather was very uncertain and play was not possible until after lunch on the opening day. Dr. Simms (the Lancashire captain) and Mr. Kirk (the Notts. skipper) did think of rolling out another wicket, because the one prepared was holding the wet to such an extent. However, they came to the conclusion, after having a second wicket struck, that it would be no better than the prepared one, consequently they made no change. Before half an hour had passed one end of the pitch was almost like a ploughed field, and the batsmen were continually gardening. The bowlers cut up the turf badly and the ball made furrows in the wicket. However, the sun enlivened the afternoon's proceedings, and if the cricket was wearisome the conditions under which the game was played were congenial.

Harkwood, the Nelson professional who has been showing a very sturdy defence, quite lived up to his reputation, remaining at the wicket over four hours for 56 not out, a rate of progress about 14 runs an hour. During his first three hours he scored thirty, so it will be noticed he livened up considerably towards the close. From a spectators' point of view it was a painful performance. Oldfield played the brightest and most enterprising cricket of the afternoon, and during his stay at the wicket he was always trying to get runs. When stumps were drawn on Wednesday evening at seven o'clock, he had scored 51 not out and Harkwood's total was 56.

On Thursday, Dr. Simms did not declare for another hour, and in that time the Lancashire total was carried to 250 for the loss of five wickets. Harris was the cause of the dismissal of Hawkwood and Oldfield, the top scorer, in one over. Notts., apart from Shipston (who batted very soundly), Gunn, Taylor and Reddish, could not do much with Cranfield, who had seven wickets for 60 runs.

YOUNG TALENT OF NOTTS.

CENTURIES BY HARRIS,
COPLEY AND KNOWLES.

BRIGHT BATTING AT
TRENT BRIDGE.

A trio of centuries by Harris, Copley and Knowles, as well as two three-figure partnerships in a score of 426 for nine wickets, put Notts. II. in a very sound position at the end of the first day's play in their Minor Counties' match with Warwickshire II. at Trent Bridge yesterday.

There seems no end to the youthful talent at Trent Bridge this season. Already three members of the ground staff in Keeton, Hardstaff and Wheat have justified the recent award of county colours, and yesterday I was agreeably surprised at the improvement shown by Harris, who made his first century of the season, and the potentialities of Knowles as a batsman.

Failures Redeemed.

Altogether Harris scored 124 out of 212 in a stay of 3 hrs. 10 mins., and his third wicket partnership with Taylor which added 103 runs, fully redeemed the failures of Shipston and G. V. Gunn, the two opening batsmen of wider experience who were sent back for only 27 runs.

There are no flourishes about Harris' batsmanship. He knows what stroke to use for every ball, and executes his shots smoothly. If he was ultra-careful after passing three figures, the soundness of his defence was always a feature, and his old fault of allowing the ball to hit the bat had entirely disappeared. Yesterday he was distinctly enterprising, and hit no fewer than 14 fours without a single error.

Taylor, who was schooled with Notts. Harrington, and still figures conspicuously with them in club cricket, also revealed style and correctness in his 44 which embraced seven boundaries.

With Harris magnificently caught at short leg, half the side were out for 218, and as there seems to be a strange shortage of left-handers in Notts., I was disappointed that we did not see more of Winrow, who was run out after a hurried 14. Left-arm bowlers and right-hand batsmen are not uncommon, but here was a left-hand batsman at last and his first square cut led me to hope for good things. But there were other bigger compensations.

Copley's Innings.

Another interesting feature of two really bright hours between lunch and tea when Notts scored at the rate of more than 75 an hour was that Syd Copley, who won fame in a minute during the Test match last year by his spectacular catch which many critics declared won the game for England, made an adventurous if not classic century.

Since that halcyon day against the Australians when he dismissed McCabe, Copley has had a lean time even with the Club and Ground, though one of its oldest members, and I congratulate him on his resurrection in the news. He drove very hard in front of the wicket but his back play was occasionally uncertain. Twice errors in the slips gave him a renewed lease of life, but he gathered courage from these incidents, and during a seventh wicket partnership with Knowles which sent the score soaring

past 300 in 44 hours and added 131 runs, played fine, forcing cricket. His 102 out of 217 took only two and a half hours, and he hit 13 fours.

Powerful Drives.

Knowles, the third batsman to exceed the century, is another youngster with the build and attributes of the real cricketer. Tall, and supple in wrist, he was always well over the ball in making his off-drive, and might well become the prettiest batsman of them all. When the clock threatened to cheat him of joining the trinity of youthful century makers he used a powerful hook and off-drive so readily that he accomplished the feat in five minutes under two hours, five minutes before stumps were drawn—much the quickest and best innings of the day. His biggest hits were 16 fours.

Warwickshire might have been spared some of their labour on a perfect wicket had they possessed anything above medium pace bowling, which the Notts. batsmen made so innocuous. Even Tate did not shine. But it was essentially a batsmen's day.

THEN WARWICK II.
COLLAPSE.

Although six wickets fell in two hours during the afternoon for 42 runs, Notts. II. were unable to drive home their advantage against Warwickshire II. at Trent Bridge yesterday, and the game ended in a draw. Notts. led on the first innings by 122.

Notts. declared at the overnight total of 426 for nine, and at lunch Warwickshire's opening batsmen had built such an excellent foundation in a partnership of 161, that it seemed highly probable the visitors would offer a serious challenge for first innings lead. Harris and Oates brought about an unexpected collapse after the first-wicket stand, however, and apart from Dobson, their captain, whose indiscriminate hitting, favoured by an escape in the slips and another at the wicket, helped him to score 36 in 33 minutes, Warwickshire crumpled badly.

Bowling Mastered.

Hill and H. R. N. Burton, the first-wicket batsmen, who scored more than half Warwickshire's runs, showed complete mastery over the attack for more than 2½ hours. Hill's 78 included 12 fours, and Burton's best hits in a fine innings of 88 were 14 boundaries.

Half the side were out in 3½ hours for 200, and two more wickets fell to Oates for the addition of six when Dobson's hard hitting stopped the rot.

Harris Five for 51.

Harris captured the eighth and ninth wickets in consecutive overs at 252, and by ending a last wicket stand of 32 between Buckingham and Wilmot finished with the best analysis of five for 51. A right hand medium paced bowler he was successful because he, above all others, kept a length.

Warwickshire batted 5½ hours for their 284.
