DREARY LANCASHIRE BATTING.

It was not surprising that there was only a mere handful of spectators on the Queen Elizabeth Grammar School ground on Wednesday, when these teams met. Firstly, because the match had not been advertised and consequently few people knew anything about it; and secondly, because the weather was very uncertain and play was not possible until after lunch on the opening day. Dr. Simms (the Lancashire captain) and Mr. Kirk (the Notts. skipper) did think of rolling out another wicket, because the one prepared was holding the wet to such an extent. However, they came to the conclusion, after having a second wicket struck. that it would be no better than the prepared one, consequently they made no change. Before half an hour had passed one end of the pitch was almost like a ploughed field, and the batsmen were continually gardening. The bowlers cut up the turf badly and the ball made furrows in the wicket. However, the sun enlivened the afternoon's proceedings, and if the cricket was wearisome the conditions under which the game was played were congenial.

Harkwood, 'the Nelson' professional who has been showing a very sturdy defence, quite lived up to his reputation, remaining at the wicket over four hours for 56 not out, a rate of progress about 14 runs an hour. During his first three hours he scored thirty, so it will be noticed he livened up considerably towards the close. From a spectators' point of view it was a painful performance. Oldfield played the brightest and most enterprising cricket of the afternoon, and during his stay at the wicket he was always trying to get runs. When stumps were drawn on Wednesday evening at seven o'clock, he had scored 51 not out and Harkwood's total was 56.

On Thursday, Dr. Simms did not declare for another hour, and in that time the Lancashire total was carried to 250 for the loss of five wickets. Altogether Harris scored 19A out of 212 in a stay of 3hrs. 10mins., and his third wicket partnership with Taylor which added 103 rune, fully redeemed the failures of Shipston and G. V. Gunn, the two opening batsmen of wider experience who were sent back for only 27 runs.

There are no flourishes about Harris batsmanship. He knows what stroke to use for every ball, and executes his shots smoothly. If he was uitracareful after passing three figures the soundness of his defence was always a feature, and his old fault of allowing the ball to hit the bat had entirely disappeared. Yesterday he was distinctly enterprising, and hit no fewer than 14 fours without a single error.

Taylor, who was schooled with Notis. Harrington, and still figures conspicuously with them in club cricket, also revealed style and correctness in his 44 which embraced seven boundaries.

With Harris magnificently caught at short leg, half the side were out for 218, and as there seems to be a strange shortage of left-handers in Notis., I was disappointed that we did not see the of Winrow, who was run out after a hurried 14. Left-arm bowlers and right-hand batsmen are not uncommon, but here was a left-hand batsman at last and his first square cut led me to hope for good things. But there were other bigger compensations.

Copley's Innings.

Another interesting feature of two really bright hours between lunch and tea when Notis scored at the rate of more than 75 an hour was that Syd Copley, who won fame in a minute during the feat match last year by his spectacular catch which many critics declared won the game for England, made an adventurous if not classic century.

Since that helcyon day against the Australians when he dismissed McCabe, Copley has had a lean time even with the Club and Ground, though one of its cidest members, and I congratulate him on his resurrection in the news. He drove very hard in front of the wicket but his back play was occasionally uncertain. Twice errors in the slips gave him a renewed lease of life, but he gathered courage from these incidents, and during a seventh wicket partnership with Knowles which sent the score soaring

past 300 in 4t hours and added 131 runs, played fine, forcing cricket. His 102 out of 217 took only two and a balf hours, and he hit 18 fours.

Powerful Drives.

Powerful Brives.

Knowles, the third batsman to exceed the century, is another youngster with the build and attributes of the real cricketer. Tall, and supple in wrist, he was always well over the ball in making his off-drive, and might well become the pretitest batsman of them all. When the clock threatened to cheat him of joining the trinity of youthful century makers he used a powerful hook and off-drive so readily that he accomplished the feat in five minutes under two hours, five minutes before siumps were drawn—ruch the quickest and best innings of he day. His biggest hits were 16 fours.

Warwickshire might have been spared some of their labour on a perfect wicket had they possessed anything above medium pace howling, which the Notts, batsmen made so innocuous, even rate did not shine. But it was essentially a batsmen's day.


