Barber, a fast right-hand bowler, displaced Grubb, but broke the partnership by dismissing Cope, after the pair had put on 27. Allan stepped in front of a ball from Barber, and was out l.b.w. and Monmouthshire had lost four wickets for 33.

Captain Phillips gave two chances, and then he and H. H. Jenkins, both forcing battenen, played with restraint.

FOR the first time this season Monmouthshire gained the lead on the first innings when at Abercarn to-day they passed Dorset's score of 215 for the loss of six wickets.
