Newport never recovered from the early dismissal of Harold Jenkins in the first over of the day. A. G. Edwards and N. D. Squire, two of Newport's youngsters, were the only batsmen to defy Creber (who is in his 38th season with Swansea) and Stevens for any length of time

Hoth Edwards and Squire—the latter was undefeated at the close of Newport's innings—hatted courageously, and Edwards, particularly, rendered Newport great service. Edwards attacked the bowling with determination. In fact, the way he treated the veteran's bowling, eventually led to his being taken off.

From Newport's point of view, the only other bright spot was the form of N. D. Squire, and had he found someone to stay with him, he might have made Newport's score look more respectable after Edwards gave an easy chance to Uren at equare leg off Stevens. Squire defended stubbornly and refused to be tempted by Greber. J. O. Gill, too, might have helped to extricate his side from their disastrous position had he been more alert when Edwards called for a run.

Left with plenty of time to get 64 runs to win, Swansea had little difficulty in achieving their object, and they passed Newport's score for the loss of two wickets. Stevens' five wickets cost only twelve runs, while Creber took 3 for 38.

WELSH CRICKET MOVE.

Gwent May Join With Glamorgan.

A meeting of representatives of Monmouthshire and Glamorgan County Cricket Clubs has been held, and Mr. M. J. Turnbull has made the following statement:

Pending a more definite result as to the outcome of our conversations, the Secretaries of the two county clubs announce that the membership of each county will be available for the matches of either club during the present season. Needless to add, the players and teams of the two counties will still retain their present identities."

It there is no opposition from the M.O.C., the probable result of the scheme will be that Glamorgan will become, to a much greater degree, representative of South Wales cricket. A suggestion is made that Glamorgan shall take over Monmouthshire's responsibilities as a minor county and run a side in the competition. Glamorgan, who will be able to draw on Gwent players, may stage first-class games in Monmouthshire. Newport has been mentioned as a possible venue.

Match at Newport.

Mr. E. C. Dolman, Honorary Secretary of Monmouthshire Club, told the South Walce Argus that, except for a few minor details, an arrangement for an amalgamation between the two clubs had practically been reached...

This will mean that in 1835 Monmouthshire will drop out of the Minor Counties competition, and that Glamorgan will run a second eleven in the competition instead. This side will be composed of Glamorgan and Monmouthshire players. Any cricketer of promise in Monmouthshire will be eligible to play for Glamorgan in the Counties Champlonship.

According to Mr. Dolman, this is the only way in which the two counties could amaigamate, for the M.C.C. oppose the suggestion that the side should be called Glamorgan and Monmouthshire combined.

Mr. Dolman mentioned that a financial agreement had been reached regarding the suggestion that Glamorgan should take over the liabilities of Monmouthshire. Under this new arrangement Glamorgan, next year, will play one first-class match at Newport, and Glamorgan Seconds will play several of their matches in Monmouthshire.

Monmouthshire's First Match.

Monmouthshire will open their Minor Counties campaign on Monday, when they play a two-day match with Kent Seconds at Abercarn. Monmouthshire meet Kent this year because Warwickshire Seconds have dropped out of the competition.

The last occasion on which the teams met was at Folkestone in August, 1914, and on the second day play was interrupted when the news came through that war had been declared. A. P. Freeman, Kent's famous spin bowler, played against Monmouthshire.

Monmouthshire have chosen thirteen players, and will have the assistance of Pitchford and Allan, the professionals from Ebbw Vale and Newport. J. Archer and J. Britten, two promising players from Abercarn, are among the thirteen players, as is Trovor Arnott, the Monmouth-born Glamorgan cricketer. T. B. Williams will be captain.

Kent will probably include W. H. Levett, who toured India with D. R. Jardine's team, Christopherson.

Play will start at 11.30 on Monday and 11.0 on Tuesday.


