# MINOR COUNTIES' CRICKET MATCH AT ASHFORD.

Kent 2nd XI. met Staffordshire at Barrow Hill last Wednesday and Thursday in the Minor Counties' Championships. As was the case last year, the match was completed early on the second morning, which was disappointing. In 1934 it was the deplorable show put up by Monmouthshire which caused the early finish, and on the present occasion the Kent 2nd XI. were the culprits.

On the form shown on Wednesday, they were no match for the Midland XI. who were a very good allround side, and their cricket was much appreciated by the company present.

The Staffordshire Captain won the toss and put Kent in, a very wise proceeding as it turned out. The visitors had two splendid slow bowlers in Backhouse and Lockett, who used the wicket to great advantage. All the same, the home county's batsmen mostly lacked enterprise and could only muster a total of 86. A. G. W. Hill, one of the opening batsmen, played well, and was able to score a useful 22, but much the best form was displayed by young J. H. Clark, who has done so well for the Ashford C.C. during the past few seasons and is now at Oxford. He showed excellent defence against some verv tricky bowling, whilst making in addition, some well-timed forcing shots. His 24, under the circumstances, was a triumph, and needless to say his success was very popular.

Staffordshire knocked up 179, nearly all their batsmen going for the bowling, which paid. Their captain, H. W. Homer, played a delightful innings of 62, and three other batsmen got useful scores, S. Crump making 33, and A. Smith and S. C. Smallman getting 27 and 21 respectively. Batting again the Kent side did no better than in their first innings, and were all out by midday on Thursday for 88, Stafford thus winning by an innings and 5 runs. As neither side could get

away until later in the afternoon, an an impromptu game was arranged to fill up part of the time, and amuse those present, each side batting for about three-quarters - of - an - hour each, and endeavouring to knock the cover off the ball. Incidentally several balls were despatched into the adjoining field and gardens, thus showing how to brighten cricket.
