### LANSDOWN & CHIPPENHAM AT COMBE PARK

#### **DANN'S BRIGHT** KNOCK

In most unsummer-like conditions and ou a rain-soaked wicket on which runs were difficult to obtain, Lansdown and Chippenham finished with a tie at Combe Park on Saturday.

This result was reached only after the game had undergone big changes. When in reply to Chippenham's laboriously compiled 101, Lansdown lost six batsmen for 49 runs, the odds were on Chippenham winning.

Then came a most exhilarating knock by Dann, who showed that the Chippenham bowlers could be hit by collecting a six and seven fours in a quick innings of 48. When he left nine runs were needed for victory with two wickets to

John made a few, but when Harding joined Dickinson, two were still required. The captain made it a tie, but the run brought Harding opposite Stevens, who bowled him first ball, so honours were shared.

Chippenham took two hours and 18 minutes to complete their 101; Lansdown, who were always scoring the faster, made their runs in an hour and a half .

Gotch and Hathaway batted with some freedom for Chippenham, but the other batsmen were not at all enterprising. On the other side, Dann overshadowed his colleagues and demonstrated that by taking risks runs could be made off accurate bowling which, with one other exception, kept the Lansdown batsmen to single figures.

Dann, who was put on as second change, had the best bowling figures for Lansdown, four for 21. Griffen had a similar number of victims for 38, and John's two wickets cost him 25 runs. Moon had a few overs which yielded ten runs.

Stevens was Chippenham's most successful trundler. His first three wickets were obtained in a couple of overs without a run being scored off him. #### FOOTBALL SEASON IN SIGHT.

#### News About Trowbridge and Chippenham.

There seems to be much more football sews in the air at the moment, and as cricket proved another "wash out" last Saturday, perhaps we can whet the appetite of football fans. After all, the big ball season is now only a few weeks ahead, and most of the fixture lists have been completed. A full list of Trowbridge Town fixtures will be found elsewhere on this page—and what a programme it is! Exclusive of cup-ties, ther are 84 league matches between August 20th and May 1st, 34 in the Western League, 22 in the Somerset League, and 28 in the Wiltahire League.

The extensive ground improvements which the club hoped to have carried out have had to be abandoned—for the time being at any rate—for such work is out of the question in view of the club's somewhat precarious financial position. The public appeal made a few weeks ago realised between 250 and 260, and it has been decided to expend this on the improvement of the worst patches on the Frome Road enclosure. There were two particularly bad patches last season—one in front of the grandstand, the other in the penalty area at the main entrance end of the ground. Work on this has already commenced, the groundsman and other helpers having undertaken to lay the drainage and returf these areas. There is no doubt that the ground will have been greatly improved by the time the season commences, and the deep mud which handicapped players so badly last winter will, it is hoped, be remedied.

Mr. R. G. Gunstone, the Trowbridge F.C. secretary, in a chat this week, said several of last season's players had re-signed, but the forms were not being returned as well as he hoped. We understand, however, that the signature of a good goal-scoring forward is likely, which should strengthen the attack considerably. As regards last year's players supporters will be sorry to hear that Eric Evans, the Western League and County back, is contemplating becoming a spectator next season. Perhaps he will change his mind before the campaign commences, for he is certainly too good a player to remain in the grandstand. Reg. Webb has made an excellent recovery from his unfortunate accident (he fractured a bone in his foot) at the end of last season, but it is doubtful whether he will be able to take his place in the side for some time yet. There seems also to be a doubt about Eric Meaden, another of the club's County sought by one or two clubs. Trowbridge supporters will, however, expect to see him in the gold and black colours of his old club when the season rolls round.

Efforts to bring about the amalgamation of Chippenham Town and Chippenham Rovers have so far failed. At the annual meeting of the forbure club last week Mr. H. A. Cruse, the president, expressed the opinion that amalgamation of the clubs was the only solution to bring about a much needed improvement in the standard of football in the town, and with this opinion many will agree, for the men of Hardenbuish and the men of Woodlands Grove would, we believe, be welded into one of the strongest amateur combinations in the county.

One day—perhaps sooner than expected—those who control the activities of the clubs will realise the wisdom of amalgama-

tion. Even now there is a strong desire by the Town to combine, but two or three of the Rovers' Committee are sticking to the system of splendid isolation. "I regret the Rovers cannot see eye-to-eye with us on this matter," said Mr. Cruse, who is making great efforts to bring about amal-gamation. "I trust, however, that the day is not too far distant when the amal-gamation will be accomplished."

By the resignation of Mr. B. Bulman, the former chairman, Chippenham Town have lost a stalwart worker and supporter. For nearly 30 years he has given his football knowledge and time to maintain the club's reputation as one of Wiltshire's best, and it is gratifying to know that at the annual meeting of the club last week Mr. Bulman was made a life member and vice-president. Mrs. Bulman has also been a great help to the club, especially in connection with the Supporters' Club. Whatever next season has in store we hope the Town will enjoy more successes than they did last year.

"Big Jim" Smith has been in the news very much since last week with his terrific hitting. In the match against Kent he scored 46 in 15 minutes! Off 13 balls he bit five 6's, two 4's, two 2's, and four singles, 18 of these coming in one over. Three of his titanic strokes sent the ball a considerable distance out of the ground. "Jim is a good shilling's worth every time," remarked "Patsy" Hendren. We agree, every time. There are many who fancy Jim's chances for a place in the Australian touring side next winter. J. C. About time, too, for not next week-end, but the one after, the football season opens. Still, there's no harm for those clubs who wish, and who have the opportunity, to extend their cricket programme for a few weeks.

Trowbridge had a busy, but not very successful, holiday programme. On Saturday they went to Weston-super-Mare with a weak team owing to the holidays, and duly pald the penalty, the home side gaining a comfortable victory. The visitors won the toss and batted first on a wicket which was surprisingly firm after the mudheaps experienced in most matches this season. From the start things went badly, and only D. Connor, Ling and Hooper displayed any confidence against a keen and varied attack. D. Connor batted in good style, and looked well set when his slowness in regaining the crease after a smart throw-in resulted in his being run out. Ling, too, looked well set, when he was adjudged libw in stepping out to Hawkins. It was left to Hooper to retrieve the situation, and he made a gallant effort to do so, but no one gave him any support, and the whole side was out for 73.
