INNINGS WIN FOR CAMBS.

After a day in the field at Denes Oval. Lowestoft, on Friday, Cambs, gained full points in their game with Suffolk, winning by an innings and 49 runs. The fatal last hour on the first day, Thursday, had helped them into a favourable position. Batting first. Cambs. totalled 394, after faltering in the middle of the innings, and Saffolk, left with 45 minutes' batting at the end of a tiring day, made 34 for the loss of four valuable wickets. An interesting feature of the game was the fact that of the Cambs, batsmen only Parish, last man in, failed to reach double figures, and he was undefeated.

Highspot of the Cambs, innings was, of course, Ridgeon's 151, probably the turning point of the game—a magnificent innings, taking into consideration the state of the wicket. His best hits were a six and 18 fours. Of the earlier batsmen, Coote was top scorer with 41, and with half the side out for 144 it looked as if Cambs, might easily lose first innings points. Ridgeon's work, however, with assistance from the remainder of the side, changed the complexion of the score sheet completely. Actually it wasn't a chanceless innings, but it was a case of fortune favouring the brave. On the whole the Suffolk catching might have been considerably better, because at least four reasonable chances and one or two more difficult ones might have been held.

As expected, the wicket proved a great asset to the bowlers, and throughout the day the batsmen were struggling against keen bowling, which was aided by an appreciable percentage of balls doing the unexpected thing. This was exemplified by the duel between Cliff Smith and Phil Mead in the first innings, One over Smith produced three balls that found a spot and kicked, Mead hastily taking his bat away, and the next over Smith repeated the performance, but this time Mead was not quick enough in taking his bat away and Coote took a simple catch. When Suffolk were all out by lunch time, with arrears of 239, it was evident that nothing short of a miracle—or the weather—could avert defeat. The possibilty of a miracle ecceded even further when Sangster was back in the pavilion with only one run on the board and the weather did nothing more than cause the loss of 25 minutes

His 83 included eight fours, one five and one six and was obtained by hitting all round the wicket. Flitton's 36 was a more careful effort. The last five wickets fell for 30 runs, and with "Mr. Extras" contributing 25, the final total was 195. Leete and Ivatt shared the wickets. Leete had secured five for 44 runs and Ivatt 5va for 78.


