His magnificent hitting had put an entirely different complexion on the game.

Peters, meanwhile, was very steady, and displaying neat touches, despite being unwell and having to have a runner. J. Cock was injured when trying to catch Peters, the ball striking him in the face. He was forced to retire, William fielding as substitute.

Hunt sent one clean into the road, and, receiving sound support from Peters, the 150 went up without further loss. Fours simply flowed from Hunt's bat, mingled with an occasional six, and it was impossible to set a field for him, though Williams failed to hold a hard chance in the deep, which was bad luck for the visitors.
