THAT the standard of pre-war cricket in West Hertfordshire was higher than that of to-day is the opinion put forward by a veteran local cricketer. Below"Cassio" discusses the claim and picks a representative side which he considers would bequite as strong as, if not stronger than, any chosen representatives from pre-war cricket.

R. E. L. HERBERT, who has been playing cricket in West Herts for more years than perhaps he cares to remember, is emphatic in his opinion that the standard of the game has deteriorated locally.

There are few real personalities nowadays, he asserts. Few players stand out above the rest and dominate the games.

Mr. Herbert is not alone in his view. Another spokesman on behalf of the veterans, an ex-captain of a local club, said, "In my day we were real cricketers. The youngsters of to-day give me a head-sche when they attempt to play. Why, they aren't even enthusiastic."

Then looking at me with the air of a man about to impart an undentable truth he challenged "And what's more you of the younger school can't deny that there is a distinct paucity of real cricketers in the neighbour-hood."

This set me thinking and I in-vited Mr. Herbert to select a repre-sentative team of

sentative team of pre-war years, eleven men who could have represented the cream of cricket in this area in the last few years preceding the war. Actually his selected men are culled from teams from the seasons 1907 to 1914, and he says "could undoubtedly beat any team of to-day." He chose the team in collaboration with two contemporaries as well versed in cricket and as competent to judge the merits of the players as himself.


#### Few Personalities


