

VETERAN'S CLAIM THIS ELEVEN COULD BEAT ANY MODERN TEAM

THAT the standard of pre-war cricket in West Hertfordshire was higher than that of to-day is the opinion put forward by a veteran local cricketer. Below "Cassio" discusses the claim and picks a representative side which he considers would be quite as strong as, if not stronger than, any chosen representatives from pre-war cricket.

MR. E. L. HERBERT, who has been playing cricket in West Herts for more years than perhaps he cares to remember, is emphatic in his opinion that the standard of the game has deteriorated locally.

There are few real personalities nowadays, he asserts. Few players stand out above the rest and dominate the games.

Mr. Herbert is not alone in his view. Another spokesman on behalf of the veterans, an ex-captain of a local club, said, "In my day we were real cricketers. The youngsters of to-day give me a headache when they attempt to play. Why, they aren't even enthusiastic."

Then looking at me with the air of a man about to impart an undeniable truth he challenged "And what's more you of the younger school can't deny that there is a distinct paucity of real cricketers in the neighbourhood."

Challenge Accepted
This set me thinking and I invited Mr. Herbert to select a representative team of pre-war years, eleven men who could have represented the cream of cricket in this area in the last few years preceding the war. Actually his selected men are culled from teams from the seasons 1907 to 1914, and he says "could undoubtedly beat any team of to-day." He chose the team in collaboration with two contemporaries as well versed in cricket and as competent to judge the merits of the players as himself.

Here I, is, with Mr. Herbert's comments:—

B. W. Atkins (county bat and an excellent slow bowler), Harry Parris (the fastest runner between the wickets I have ever seen), Arthur Chester (brother of the famous Test match umpire—a grand bat), E. S. Household (the greatest boy bat ever known in the county. Would have been in the Test class. Killed in the war), A. Grimsdell (wicketkeeper of the highest class. Once scored over 200 for Watford against West Herts), Dr. Norman Clarke, H. E. Blower (a fine bat), T. W. Chant (another bat of real merit), A. E. Barker (once took 10 wickets for 0 against Stanmore) or E. W. Brown, E.

G. Breed or O. J. Butler, E. J. Bull (a great all-rounder).

Few Personalities

Picking a representative team to cover the last ten years was no easy matter. A close study of the "Observer" files during that period revealed many names of men who shone in club cricket, but I must admit that there were few outstanding personalities. Whether the average standard of play has risen and swallowed up players who would have shone in the past, and whether play has deteriorated with time will always be subjects for argument whenever cricket is discussed.

They are questions that will never be satisfactorily answered.

The veterans have their opinions and their frank and open criticism is seldom resented by the players of to-day.

'Present' Selections

After careful consideration and with the help of records recorded in the "Observer" files this is the team I would confidently place in the field against Mr. Herbert's eleven, in order of batting:—

W. W. Coverdale (British and Dominion and ex-Leavesden), G. Rollo Walker (Bushey), F. C. de Saram (Bushey), C. W. Ford (Watford Grammar School), W. Palmer (Leavesden), A. L. Goodall (West Herts), A. Joiner (Chipperfield), N. K. F. Porter (Hemel Hempstead), C. J. Dean (Leavesden), T. Watson (Leavesden), E. J. Pascoe (Abbots Langley).

Strictly speaking Arthur Grimsdell should change sides, but Dean would prove an able substitute as wicketkeeper.

The side as above was not picked without difficulty. G. T. S. Stevens, the ex-Middlesex and England spin bowler I omitted because he only occasionally assists Tring Park, from which club Kempster and Hedges would be useful members of any representative side.

V. A. Barnes (Rickmansworth), J. R. Southerst, N. Lane and R. I. S. Eade (West Herts), E. J. Lambkin (Leavesden), J. Bates (Chipperfield), D. F. Smee (Bushey), D. Priestley (Chorleywood), S. Capel (Hemel Hempstead), and A. W. Briers (Abbots Langley), and J. B. D. Chapman (Stanmore), were players on my original "long list."

I think I would prefer even to take part in a Spelling Bee than attempt to choose another representative side!

C. WARD'S WHIRLWIND 25 MINUTES

Hitting a six and twenty fours in a whirlwind undefeated innings of 99, Cyril Ward, the fast bowler, ended the innings of his life for the Ramblers against G.W.R. at Castle Bar Park.

Going in when the score was 118, the left-hander immediately attacked the bowling with such success that within twenty-five minutes he had reached 99. His partner, who had watched Ward score 43 runs, was then out for obstruction, and Ward was denied his maiden century. There was no semblance of a fluke about his hitting, which was as clean as it was punishing.

Some of his boundaries were the result of brilliant shots technically correct and perfect in execution.

Eade was the next best batsman with a stylish 67, and Morgan gave the scintillating Ward stubborn support.

G.W.R. tackled their task with determination, but the Ramblers looked to be set for a win when eight wickets had fallen for 163. When Swallow went to the wicket the score was 242, and with a mishit off Ward, which second slip nearly held, and which yielded 4 runs, he gave the Railwaymen an exciting victory.
